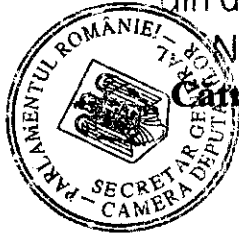

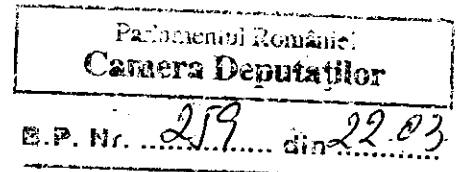

**Informare cu privire la Micul Dejun Național cu Rugăciune
de la Washington D.c. din 02,03 și 04 februarie 2011**

În zilele de 02,03 și 04 februarie 2011, s-a desfășurat la Washington D.C., Statele Unite ale Americii, cea de-a 59-a reuniune a „Micului Dejun Național cu Rugăciune”.

Această acțiune, care s-a desfășurat la Hotelul Hilton Washington, reprezintă o formă instituționalizată de colaborare interparlamentară cu caracter religios, care reunește parlamentari, oficiali guvernamentali, diplomați, reprezentanți ai cultelor, oameni de cultură, oameni de afaceri, ș.a. din peste 130 de țări.

Principalul invitat al reuniunii de anul acesta a fost domnul Barak Obama, președintele Statelor Unite ale Americii.

Din Româna, au participat la acest eveniment național religios domniile deputați Dorel Covaci (PSD) și Cristinel Marius Dugulescu (PD-L), membri ai Grupului Ecumenic de Rugăciune din Parlamentul României.

Președintele Barak Obama a salutat invitații prezenți la reuniune și a vorbit despre valorile creștine în politică, despre rugăciune și familie. Totodată, a solicitat persoanelor alese, care au putere de decizie, să se bazeze pe credința în Dumnezeu atunci când elaborează legile.

A vorbit despre importanța rugăciunii și despre rolul ei în viața națiunii americane și în întreaga lume și a îndemnat pe toți să facă rugăciuni pentru el, pentru S.U.A și pentru țara lor, pentru pace, pentru toleranță și pentru progres. A vorbit despre credința în Iisus Hristos, arătând că rugăciunea este o „forță de susținere” în viață, iar credința un mod de conviețuire între popoare.

Președintele S.U.A s-a rugat și pentru eliminarea conflictelor, a violențelor de pe glob și pentru rezolvarea pașnică a evenimentelor din Egipt.

Au fost prezenți, de asemenea, și au luat cuvântul domnul Jeff Miller, reprezentantul Statului Florida, doamna Ann Kirkpatrick, reprezentanta Statului Arizona, domnul Larry Kissell, reprezentantul Statului Carolina de Nord, domnul Jeff Sessions, senator de Alabama, membru al Grupului de Rugăciune din Senatul S.U.A, domnul deputat J. Randy Forbes, reprezentantul Statului Virginia, domnul J. Vilsack, secretar pe agricultură, precum și scriitorul și regizorul Randall Wallace.



Aderholt, reprezentantul Statului Alabama, iar în data de 03 februarie 2011, cu senatorul Mark Kirk și senatorul Jeane Shaheen. La reuniunea de la ambasadă au mai participat domnul Gheorghe Falcă, primarul Aradului, domnul Radu Țârle, președintele Consiliului Județean Bihor, precum și alți români stabiliți în S.U.A. Cu acest prilej s-a realizat o scurtă evaluare a prezenței delegației române la acest eveniment.

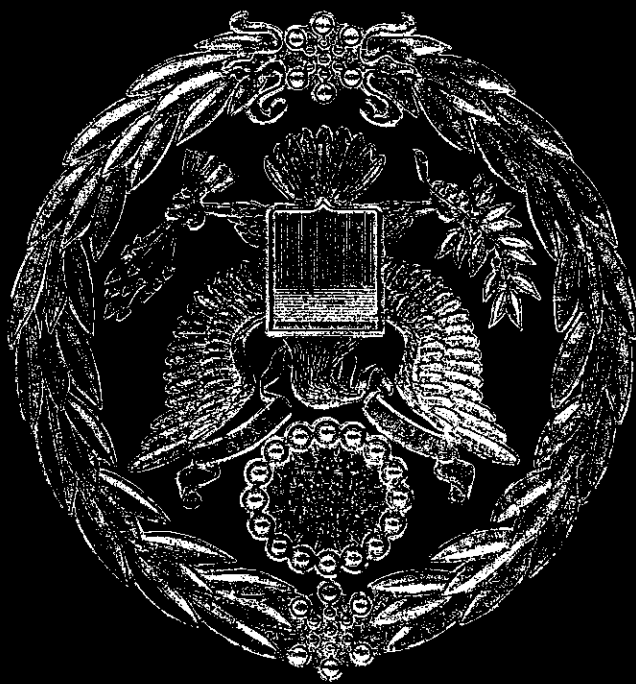
