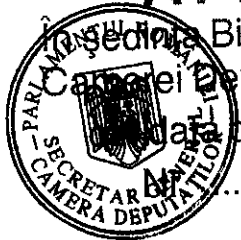

**Tema: Participare la reuniunea „Schimbări climatice – opțiuni pentru o orientare concertată a politicii” (Belgia, Bruxelles 22 - 25 iunie 2009)**

În cadrul Săptămânii verzi a Comisiei Europene, Direcția generală pentru mediu, în colaborare cu asociația „Prietenii Europei” va organiza la Bruxelles, Belgia în perioada 23 - 24 iunie a.c., reuniunea cu titlul „**Schimbări climatice – opțiuni pentru o orientare concertată a politicii**”.

- Recalcularea cheltuielilor se va face la întoarcerea în țară pe baza documentelor justificative.

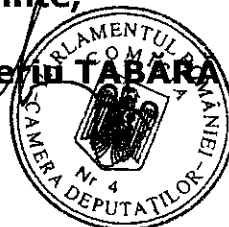

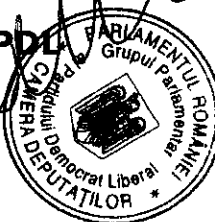
