Copenhaga, Danemarca, 24-28 octombrie 2007

În perioada 24-28 octombrie 2007, la Copenhaga, Danemarca, va avea loc cea de-a II-a Conferință a Tinerilor Lideri Politici.

Reuniunea va fi organizată de Asociația Asia-Europa (ASEF) și de Consiliul Danez pentru Tineret ce va reuni 85 de reprezentanți din fiecare din cele 45 de țări care constituie ASEM (Asia-Europe Meeting).

ASEM reprezintă cadrul neoficial al dialogului și cooperării care reunește toți membrii Uniunii Europene, membrii Asociației Națiunilor din Asia de Sud-Est (ASEAN), de asemenea, Comisia Europeană, China, Coreea de Sud și Japonia. Din 2007, la ASEM s-au alăturat și noile state membre ale Uniunii Europene, respectiv, România și Bulgaria, alte țări, precum, India, Pakistan, Mongolia și Secretariatul ASEAN.

Reuniunea va dezbate probleme cu privire la viitorul ASEM și reacția tinerilor la problemele majore ale lumii contemporane, inclusiv interdependența dintre Asia și Europa ca rezultat al creșterii migrației inter-regionale și al procesului de globalizare.

Organizatorii au anunțat **criteriile de selecție a participanților la conferință:**

- **vârsta participanților să fie cuprinsă între 18 și 35 de ani;**

- să cunoască foarte bine limba engleză (limba oficială a conferinței);
- să ocupe o poziție de responsabilitate într-o organizație politică, sau într-o organizație de tineret recunoscută ca având influențe politice naționale sau internaționale;
- să posede calități de conducere în sensul obligării și implicării mai mult în problemele societății;
- să aibă o perspectivă de ansamblu și un profund interes în cooperarea internațională și promovarea unei puternice legături între Asia și Europa;
- să fie capabili să înțeleagă problemele cu care se confruntă tineretul atât în plan național cât și internațional.

Termenul limită comunicat de către organizatori pentru înregistrarea participanților este **data de 10 septembrie 2007.**

Menționăm că **selecția finală a participanților va fi făcută de către organizatori.**

De asemenea, organizatorii au comunicat faptul că suportă toate cheltuielile legate de activitățile conferinței, inclusiv programul oficial cultural, cazarea din perioada 24-28 octombrie a.c., mesele și transportul local, urmând ca parlamentele naționale să suporte cheltuielile legate de transportul internațional.

CALL FOR PARTICIPATION

The Asia-Europe Foundation and the Danish Youth Council are pleased to invite your organisation to propose candidates to participate in the **2nd Conference for Young Political Leaders**, to be held in Denmark from 24-28 October 2007. The Conference will gather up to 85 representatives from each of the 45 ASEM partners and the organisers will select the participants so as to ensure political and geographical balance.

At the 5th Asia-Europe Meeting (ASEM 5) held in Hanoi, Vietnam in October 2004, Heads of State and Government and the European Commission recognised the global and multidimensional nature of the trends and developments in the current international situation. Corollary to their commitment to strengthen co-ordination and cooperation among the ASEM members, the ASEM Leaders underlined the role of the youth as key actors in revitalising and substantiating the Asia-Europe partnership, through enhanced and intensified dialogue, exchanges, and joint cooperation. It is within this context that the ASEM Leaders adopted an initiative to organise the first conference for young political leaders in Asia and Europe.

The inaugural conference was held in Beijing and Tianjin, China in November 2005 and the theme was *The Role of Youth in Further Revitalising and Substantiating the Asia-Europe Partnership*. Key issues such as youth involvement in ASEM and youth work and development within the context of globalisation were discussed and presented, and the Tianjin Declaration was drafted.

In order to continue the work of the inaugural conference and further consolidate ties between young political leaders in Asia and Europe, Denmark took on the task of organising the 2nd Conference for Young Political Leaders in Copenhagen, Denmark in October 2007. As with previous Asia-Europe Young Leaders Symposia, a multi-sectoral and future-oriented process shall be conducted to allow participants to discuss key issues, trends and challenges confronting the two regions and brainstorm possible solutions.

* ASEM (The Asia-Europe Meeting) is an informal process of dialogue and cooperation bringing together all the members of the European Union (EU), the members of the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN), as well as the European Commission, China, South Korea, and Japan. In 2007, ASEM further grew to include Bulgaria, Romania, India, Pakistan, Mongolia, and the ASEAN Secretariat.

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FACT SHEET

INTRODUCTION

What is the Asia-Europe Young Leaders Symposium? The Asia-Europe Young Leaders Symposium (AEYLS) originated from a proposal made under the framework of the Asia-Europe Meeting (ASEM) to establish a dialogue platform among young leaders to strengthen cultural links and mutual understanding between Asia and Europe. Asia-Europe Young Leaders Symposia are conceived as fora that provide opportunities for closer and more regular contacts and dialogue on a wide range of issues among leaders of the next generation of Asia and Europe. The process is multi-sectoral and future-oriented to allow young leaders from Asia and Europe to discuss key issues, trends, and challenges confronting the two regions and to brainstorm possible solutions.

What is ASEM? ASEM is an informal process of dialogue and cooperation bringing together all the members of the European Union (EU), the members of the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN), as well as the European Commission, China, South Korea, and Japan. In 2007, ASEM further grew to include Bulgaria, Romania, India, Pakistan, Mongolia, and the ASEAN Secretariat. The objective of ASEM is to forge a stronger partnership between Asia and Europe that is based on equal partnership, mutual respect, and mutual benefit. The three pillars of the ASEM dialogue process – which extends beyond the political and official levels and encompasses the business and people sectors of the two regions – are political dialogue on regional and global issues, enhanced economic cooperation, and cooperation in the social, cultural, and educational fields.

Why a 2nd Conference for Young Political Leaders? At the 5th Asia-Europe Meeting (ASEM 5) held in Hanoi, Vietnam in October 2004, Heads of State and Government and the European Commission recognised the global and multidimensional nature of the trends

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and developments in the current international situation. A long list of serious challenges having a global and multifaceted nature calls for considered responses through a multilateral approach and collective action. The onus lies on Asia and Europe, as two key regions representing more than half of the world's population, its major religions, and its natural resources, to work together to address these challenges.

The ASEM Leaders underlined the role of the youth as key actors in revitalising and substantiating the Asia-Europe partnership, through enhanced and intensified dialogue, exchanges and joint collaboration. It is within this context that they adopted an initiative to organise the first conference for young political leaders in Asia and Europe. The inaugural conference was held in Beijing and Tianjin, China in November 2005 and the theme was *The Role of Youth in Further Revitalising and Substantiating the Asia-Europe Partnership*. Key issues such as youth involvement in ASEM and youth work and development within the context of globalisation were discussed and presented. A further result of the conference was the drafting of the Tianjin Declaration and a General Report, the former of which was presented at ASEM 6 in Helsinki, Finland in September 2006. In order to continue the work of the inaugural conference and further consolidate ties between young political leaders in Asia and Europe, Denmark took on the task of organising the 2nd Conference for Young Political Leaders in Copenhagen, Denmark in October 2007.

What are the projected outcomes of this meeting? The conference shall examine the future of ASEM and youth responses to global challenges, including the growing interdependence between Asia and Europe as a result of an increase in trade and inter-regional migration, and the role of multilateralism in a just international order. Furthermore, the meeting will focus on the challenges of global warming and the need for an Asia-Europe alliance in this respect. The conference shall also draft and disseminate a subsequent Report and Declaration, which will be submitted for the consideration of the ASEM Heads of State and Government in October 2008.

Who are the ASEM partners?

From Asia: Brunei, Cambodia, China, India, Indonesia, Japan, Korea, Laos, Malaysia, Mongolia, Myanmar, Pakistan, Philippines, Singapore, Thailand, Vietnam, and the ASEAN Secretariat;

From Europe: Austria, Belgium, Bulgaria, Cyprus, Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Ireland, Italy, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, Netherlands, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden, the UK, and the European Commission.

PARTICIPANTS

Participants are expected to arrive on Wednesday 24 October 2007 for registration and the welcome reception and dinner. The draft programme is attached as *Annex A*.

The programme involves a combination of plenary and working group sessions, and dialogue with key institutions in the host country. Interaction among the participants is emphasised and adequate time will be allocated for discussions in the workshops among the participants.

Participants will be divided into three **Working Groups** to engage in more in-depth discussion on issues that would be identified as youth priorities. Inputs from the Working Groups shall contribute to a Report and Declaration.

- Working Group I.** Global Flows of Trade and Migration: Increased Interdependence Between Asia and Europe
- Working Group II.** ASEM and Global Warming: The Need for an Asia-Europe Alliance
- Working Group III.** The Role of Multilateralism in a Just International Order: The Case for an Asia-Europe Partnership

A social/cultural programme is organised to enable the participants to learn more about the politics, economics, culture, and history of the host country.

WORKING LANGUAGE

The official language of communication shall be English.

CRITERIA FOR PARTICIPATION

The 2nd Conference for Young Political Leaders will gather up to 85 participants from the 45 ASEM partners who:

- Are between the ages of 18 and 35;
- Are proficient in English (the official language of the conference);
- Hold a position of responsibility in a political organisation, or a youth organisation recognised as having an influence on national or international politics;
- Possess leadership qualities, with a sense of commitment to and involvement in the wider society;
- Have a global outlook and a keen interest in international cooperation and the promotion of strong links between Asia and Europe;
- Are aware of national or international youth issues in relation to the identified topics.

FEES AND OTHER EXPENSES

There is no participation fee for the programme. The organisers shall bear the costs for all activities related to the conference, including the official cultural programme, accommodation from 24-28 October, meals, and local transportation.

All participants are, however, requested to cover their own travel costs to Copenhagen, Denmark. The organisers shall be offering a partial travel subsidy for participants who need assistance with their international travel costs.

The maximum amount for such subsidy is EUR 250 for those residing in Europe and EUR 500 for those residing in Asia. Participants residing in Denmark are not considered eligible for the travel subsidy.

Interested parties should send the completed Registration Form attached as Annex B along with their updated detailed curriculum vitae or resume to the designated co-ordinators no later than **Monday 10th September 2007**. Applicants are kindly asked not to confirm their travel arrangements until after receiving the official invitation from the organisers.

ABOUT THE WORKING GROUP SESSIONS

1. Participants will be divided into 3 Working Groups. They will remain in the same Working Group that will meet over three sessions (about 3 hours per session), to enable them to engage in more in-depth exchange on the issues covered by each Working Group.
2. Participants will be consulted at the first session of each Working Group on the list of items to be discussed, and modifications to the list will be made accordingly.
3. Each Working Group will have a designated Facilitator who will steer and guide the discussions at each session. The Facilitator is tasked to manage the discussion with maximum efficiency, with a view both towards ensuring a good exchange of perspectives and producing a set of recommendations.
4. Each Working Group will select/appoint a Rapporteur from amongst themselves. The Rapporteur shall be responsible for capturing the main points of discussion and recommendations at each session, for all sessions.
5. Each Working Group's Rapporteur and Facilitator shall draft the Report of the Working Group. Each Working Group's Facilitator will make a 10-minute presentation of its Report at the second and final Plenary Session.
6. The General Rapporteur designated by the Conference organisers will facilitate the working process and provide guidance to the Facilitator and Rapporteur of each Working Group.
7. The General Rapporteur will compile the reports of all three Working Groups and draft the General Report of the Conference.

The Working Groups have been assigned the following topics:

Working Group I.

Global Flows of Trade and Migration: Increased Interdependence Between Asia and Europe

The rapid growth of the Asian economy has created new opportunities both in Asia and Europe and has made a considerable impact on the interdependence between the two regions. The growing movement of jobs from Europe to Asia and the increase in interregional trade has generated widespread discussion about the consequences of globalisation. These consequences and the increased interdependence call for the strengthening of ties between future generations of leaders in the two

regions.

Working Group II.

ASEM and Global Warming: The Need for an Asia-Europe Alliance

The global nature of climate change requires the widest possible cooperation and participation, and there is a need for strengthening the exchange of ideas and experiences between Asia and Europe. Possible issues for discussion include global warming, the interrelation between energy security, economic growth, and climate change, and strategies for youth involvement in and awareness of environmental issues.

Working Group III.

The Role of Multilateralism in a Just International Order: The Case for an Asia-Europe Partnership

As stressed at ASEM 6 in Helsinki, Finland, contemporary challenges and threats recognise no national boundaries, are interlinked and require common solutions. Therefore, the role of multilateralism, and especially the UN, is crucial in establishing a just international order. Possible issues for discussion include the prospects of an Asia-Europe partnership based on common values and goals that may strengthen interregional cooperation and ensure global influence for all ASEM partners.
