În data de 24.X.2007 Biroul permanent al Camerei Deputaților a aprobat memorandumul nr. 58/178/24.X.2007, pentru participarea domnului deputat **Alin George Teodorescu**, în perioada 06 – 09 noiembrie a.c., la o serie de dezbateri, pe teme din domeniul agriculturii, justiției, concurenței, care vor avea loc la Comisia Europeană cât și la audierea publică privind legislația utilizării spațiului, la invitația domnului Graham Watson, liderul grupului parlamentar ALDE, la Parlamentul European .

Acțiunea are caracter parlamentar conform art.3 din HBP nr.1, modificată prin HBP nr.5/2007.

Propunem:

- Deplasarea să se facă cu avionul, pe ruta București-Bruxelles-București , cu plecare în data de 06 noiembrie a.c., ora 07,20 (cursa RO 371) și întoarcerea în ziua de 09 noiembrie a.c., ora 14,05 (cursa RO 372);

- Să se acorde drepturi de diurnă cat.a II-a, 100%, pentru 3 ½ zile, drepturi de cazare plafon B, pentru 3 nopți, precum și un avans de 50% cu decontare ulterioară;
- Recalcularea cheltuielilor se va face la întoarcerea în țară pe baza documentelor justificative.

Dear Mr. Teodorescu,

I am writing to invite you for an international parliamentary hearing on space policy, which will take place on November 7, 2007 in the European Parliament, Brussels, organised by the e-Parliament. At the hearing, legislators from Africa, Asia and the Americas will meet with European legislators to discuss how best to balance cooperation and competition in the civil and military uses of outer space. The importance of this question has been highlighted by the recent Chinese test of an anti-satellite weapon, the growing problems of space debris, and the increasingly difficult debate on missile defence between Europe, the US and Russia.

The e-Parliament is a fairly new global forum, which engages national and regional legislators through polls and hearings to exchange policy ideas and to work together across borders on issues of common concern. Space policy is one of a number of areas we are working in.

The e-Parliament held a first hearing in the US Congress in September 2005 focused specifically on space weapons and missile defence. It brought together US legislators and members of defence and foreign affairs committees from around the world, representing a wide range of views on the case for and against space weapons. A detailed report from that event can be found at www.e-parl.net.

Our hearing in Brussels on November 7 will - as outlined in the programme below - take a broader view and consider both the military and civil uses of space, the challenges facing each of the two areas as well as the overlaps and competition between them. Outer space is often referred to as a new frontier of opportunities for humankind. But it is not limitless, and if everyone is to benefit, we must find ways to carefully balance cooperation and competition in this global commons.
