Camera Deputaților va fi reprezentată la modulele organizate în perioada **20-23 mai 2008** de o delegație formată din domnul deputat **Mihai Tudose (PSD)**, președintele Comisiei pentru politică economică, reformă și privatizare, domnul **Mihai Unghianu**, secretar general adjunct al Camerei Deputaților și domnul **Vasile Lapteș**, director, Direcția pentru tehnologia informațiilor și comunicații.

Acțiunea are caracter parlamentar conform art.3, alin.d. al HBP 1/2003 modificată și completată prin HBP 5/2007.

Propunem:

- să se aprobe participarea delegației parlamentare la acțiunea menționată;
- deplasarea să se efectueze cu avionul pe ruta București-Zurich-Geneva-București, cu plecare din București în 19 mai 2008, ora 14:25 (LX 1885) și întoarcere în 24 mai 2008, ora 13:05 (LX 1892) conform traseului alăturat;
- să se acorde drepturi de diurnă categoria a II-a, 100%, pentru 5 zile, cazare plafon B pentru 5 nopți și un avans de 50% cu decontare ulterioară;
- recalcularea cheltuielilor să se facă la întoarcerea în țară pe baza documentelor justificative.

Background

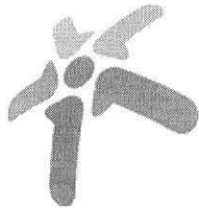
The emergence of the information society presents both opportunities and challenges for parliament as it seeks to affirm itself as a vital democratic institution of the 21st century. Parliament is the central institution representing the people in a democracy, and it plays a critical role in advancing social and political values that benefit all members of a community in all their diversity.

As the primary institutions exercising legislative, oversight and representative functions, parliaments have clear political and institutional responsibilities in the shaping of the information society of the future, regardless of the development level of the country they represent. They can do so at national level by fostering a political environment conducive to the development of an equitable and inclusive information society, by ensuring that all different segments are represented in it, by addressing and protecting fundamental rights, and by acting as institutional guarantors vis-à-vis all actors involved. In so doing, their role inevitably transcends the domestic level as institutions and citizens live today in an increasingly interdependent society, of which the Internet and the Web are major engines. At the international level, parliaments can cooperate, exchange experiences and engage in debates to bring a parliamentary dimension to the implementation of the World Summit on the Information Society (WSIS).

In addition, by making full use of information and communication technologies, parliaments can play a leading role in the advancement of the information society and be prepared to face the challenges brought by its dynamics.

Yet, parliaments and legislators worldwide still need to play a more proactive role as promoters of the principles of the World Summit on the Information Society through their legislative and oversight responsibilities both at national and international level.

The international community has repeatedly called for a reinforced cooperation between the United Nations and parliaments around the world in the implementation of the international development agenda, including on the role that governing institutions can play in shaping the information society. The outcome documents of the 2005 World Summit, the World Summit on the Information Society, and several resolutions of the United Nations General Assembly reflect this spirit.

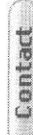
