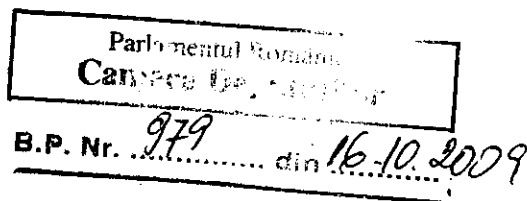

**Tema: Participarea la "Masa rotundă privind ajutorul pentru comerț în
Asia Centrală și la Conferința privind comerțul pentru economiile
în tranziție"
Geneva, Elveția, 26-27 octombrie 2009**

În perioada 26-27 octombrie 2009 vor avea loc la Geneva, sub egida Națiunilor Unite „Masa rotundă privind ajutorul pentru comerț în Asia Centrală și Conferința privind comerțul pentru economiile în tranziție”.

La aceste acțiuni urmează să participe domnul deputat Iulian Iancu (Grupul parlamentar al Alianței PSD + PC), președintele Comisiei pentru industrii și servicii din Camera Deputaților.

Masa rotundă va avea ca obiectiv obținerea de sprijin deplin din partea țărilor SPECA (Programul Special al Națiunilor Unite pentru Economii în Asia Centrală) în cadrul acestui proces și să permită participanților din țările cu economii în tranziție să aibă întâlniri cu reprezentanți ai unor organizații internaționale reprezentative.

Conferința privind dezvoltarea comerțului și facilitarea economiilor în tranziție va dezbate teme precum: aderarea țărilor SPECA la Organizația Mondială a Comerțului, armonizarea legislativă în domeniul comerțului și comerțul electronic, analizarea nevoilor pentru dezvoltarea comerțului și a facilităților în regiune.

Acțiunea nu are caracter parlamentar conform art.5, lit. b) din HBP 1/2003 cu modificările și completările din HBP 5/2007.

Propunem:

- să se aprobe participarea domnului deputat Iulian Iancu, președintele Comisiei pentru industrii și servicii, la aceste acțiuni;
- deplasarea să se efectueze cu avionul, pe ruta București-Geneva și retur, cu plecare în data de 25 octombrie a.c., orele 11.30, zbor LX 1893 și întoarcere în data de 28 octombrie a.c., orele 10.55, zbor LX 1892;
- să se acorde drepturi diurnă categoria I, 100% pentru 3 zile, cazare plafon A pentru 3 nopți;
- recalcularea cheltuielilor să se efectueze la întoarcerea în țară pe baza documentelor justificative.

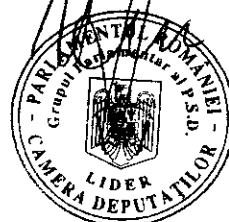

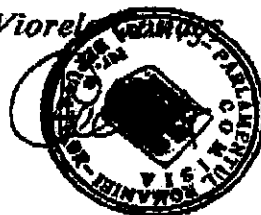

Dear Madam/Sir,

We are honoured to invite you to a Round Table on Aid-for-Trade for Central Asia and a Conference on Trade for the economies in transition, scheduled for 26-27 October 2009 in the Palais des Nations in Geneva.

These events will be preceded, on the morning of 26 October 2009, by the fourth session of the Project Working Group on Trade (PWG on Trade) of the United Nations Special Programme for the Economies of Central Asia (SPECA, in which the following countries participate: Afghanistan, Azerbaijan, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Tajikistan, Turkmenistan and Uzbekistan). You are also welcome to participate as an observer in that meeting, which will be chaired by Ms Kislyakova, Deputy Minister of Economic Development and Trade of Tajikistan, and will be attended by other Vice Ministers from the SPECA countries. The meeting will discuss the future activities of the SPECA Working Group and its institutional support to the initiative *Aid-for-Trade Road Map for SPECA*. Your input to that discussion would also be appreciated.

The objective of the Round Table on Aid-for-Trade on the afternoon of 26 October 2009 is to obtain full support from SPECA countries to this process and to allow participants from countries with economies in transition to meet representatives of the major international organizations and development partners supporting Aid-for-Trade and the associated Road Map for SPECA initiative.

A Conference on Trade Development and Facilitation for Transition Economies will then take place on 27 October 2009. It will be focused on: WTO accession of the SPECA countries; legislative and regulatory harmonization in the areas of trade and electronic business; and an analysis of the needs for trade development and facilitation in the region. The results of this Conference will provide input to the trade sub-programme of the UNECE, including its ongoing cooperation with the WTO Aid for Trade process.
