Tema: Participarea la cea de-a XI-a Conferință anuală interparlamentară privind spațiul (Londra, 25-27 octombrie 2009)

În perioada 25-27 octombrie 2009, va avea loc, la Londra, cea de-a XI-a Conferință anuală europeană interparlamentară privind spațiul, organizată sub egida Comisiei parlamentare pentru spațiu din Parlamentului britanic, împreună cu Institutul European pentru Politica Spațiului Cosmic (European Space Policy Institute, ESPI).

Tema centrală a conferinței este "Aplicații spațiale în rezolvarea problemelor cotidiene" care va fi supusă dezbaterii în cadrul lucrărilor. Pe agenda conferinței mai sunt prevăzute teme precum „Inovare și dezvoltare în domeniul spațiului cosmic”, „Provocările schimbărilor climatice și rolul sateliților spațiali” și desemnarea următorului stat care va prelua președinția Conferinței europene interparlamentare privind spațiul (EISC), deținută în prezent de Marea Britanie, unde și România este țară candidată.

Între oficialii invitați să participe la conferință se numără parlamentari din statele europene, reprezentanți de agenții spațiale, de organizații nonguvernamentale, experți în domeniul activității spațiale.

Din partea Camerei Deputaților, la această conferință vor participa doamna deputată **Liana Dumitrescu (Grupul parlamentar al minorităților naționale)**, președinta Subcomisiei pentru spațiu a Camerei Deputaților, domnul deputat **Petru Farago (UDMR)**, membru al aceleiași subcomisii, precum și doamna **Irina Alecu**, consultant în cadrul Direcției pentru cooperare parlamentară internațională multilaterală, secretara delegației.

Acțiunea are caracter parlamentar conform art. 3, lit. e din HBP 1/2003 cu modificările și completările ulterioare din HBP 5/2007.

Propunem:

- să se aprobe participarea la această acțiune a doamnei deputate Liana Dumitrescu, a domnului deputat Petru Farago, precum și a doamnei Irina Alecu, secretara delegației;
- deplasarea să se efectueze cu avionul, pe ruta București – Londra și retur, cu plecare în data de 25 octombrie 2009, ora 09:55 (RO 391) și întoarcere în data de 28 octombrie 2009, ora 17:50 (RO 392), conform traseului anexat;
- să se acorde drepturi de diurnă categoria a II-a, 100%, pentru 3 ½ zile, drepturi de cazare plafon B pentru 3 nopți, precum și un avans de 50% cu decontare ulterioară;
- recalcularea cheltuielilor se va face la întoarcerea în țară, pe baza documentelor justificative.

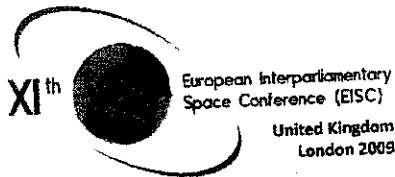

Dear Colleagues,

It is my pleasure to invite you to attend the European Interparliamentary Space Conference's 2009 Annual Conference, which will take place in and around the UK Parliament. The first event will be during the evening of Sunday 25th October 2009 and the meeting will continue until lunchtime on Tuesday 27th October 2009.

I am delighted to host this year's EISC, on behalf of the Parliamentary Space Committee, and I am grateful for the generous support of both the British Government and the UK space sector. The EISC is the centrepiece political event in the European space calendar, and is a key opportunity to celebrate space activity, to discuss key policy issues, and to encourage political awareness and discussion. It brings together European parliamentarians with space agency representatives, industry leaders and related experts to discuss the problem solving character of space applications, both in the commercial and public policy domains, as well as space science. We have chosen as this year's theme "Space as a Problem Solver", to highlight the growing importance of space and space applications to our daily lives, to policy making, and to the European economy.

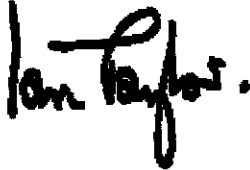
Following the official welcome reception by UK industry in the fascinating venue of the Science Museum on the Sunday, the conference continues on the Monday with speeches from three leading space personalities from the UK and Europe, which will explore three key themes – space serving society, space as a lead market and space for innovation and growth. These are followed by three presentations offering space solutions to some of the most pressing policy challenges Europe faces today. I am keen to place lively discussion at the heart of this year's conference. Accordingly, both morning sessions will be followed by an open debate amongst the panellists and parliamentary delegates.

In keeping with this year's theme, I have asked each delegation to provide two case studies that highlight their country's approach to solving national policy problems, or encouraging wealth creation, through the use of space applications. The Monday afternoon session will showcase these examples of problem solving using space, and provide an opportunity to share ideas and approaches from across Europe.

EISC is a great opportunity to both raise the profile of European space activity, and to discuss amongst parliamentarians some of the most pressing issues and opportunities. To balance these twin aims, we have invited a wider community of leading personalities to the Monday session of this year's conference, while the Tuesday morning session, and the debates, will remain closed to EISC parliamentary delegates and longstanding observers of the conference.

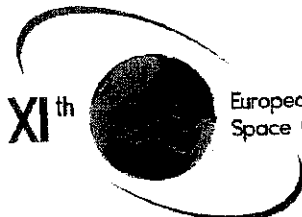

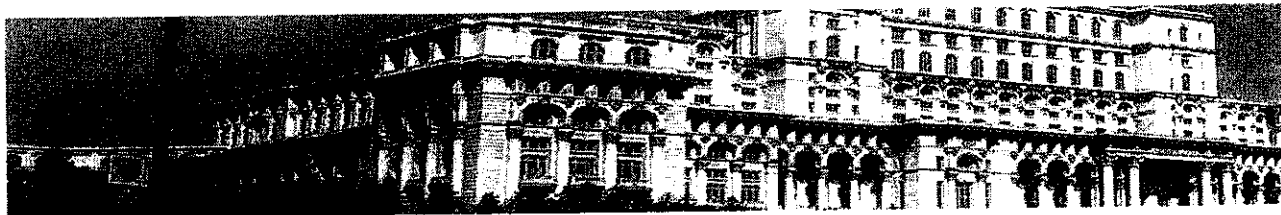
