**Tema: Participarea la Conferința „Politica Agricolă Comună – post 2013”
(Bruxelles, 19-20 iulie 2010)**

În perioada 19-20 iulie 2010, se va desfășura, la Bruxelles, Conferința cu tema „Politica Agricolă Comună – post 2013”, organizată de Direcția generală pentru agricultură și dezvoltare rurală a Comisiei Europene.

Conferința, care va fi prezidată de domnul Dacian Cioloș, Comisarul european pentru agricultură, este precedată de o dezbatere extinsă pe întreg teritoriul Uniunii Europene privind punctul de vedere atât al părților interesate, cât și al societății în general, cu privire la viitorul politicii agricole comune, obiectivele, principiile și contribuțiile sale la strategia „Europa 2020”.

Obiectivul Conferinței este de a reuni elementele de contribuții prezentate în perioada de dezbatere și de a oferi posibilitatea de a continua discuțiile în jurul unor teme generale precum: „De ce avem nevoie de o politică agricolă comună?”, „Ce așteptări au cetățenii de la politica agricolă?”, „De ce este nevoie de o reformă a politicii agricole comune?”

Propunem:

- deplasarea să se efectueze cu avionul, pe ruta București – Bruxelles și retur, cu plecare în data de 18 iulie 2010, ora 17:20 (RO 373) și întoarcere în data de 21 iulie 2010, ora 14:00 (RO 372), conform traseului anexat;
- să se acorde drepturi de diurnă categoria a II-a, 100%, pentru 3 zile, cazare plafon B pentru 3 nopți și un avans de 50% cu decontare ulterioară;
- recalcularea cheltuielilor să se facă la întoarcerea în țară, pe baza documentelor justificative.

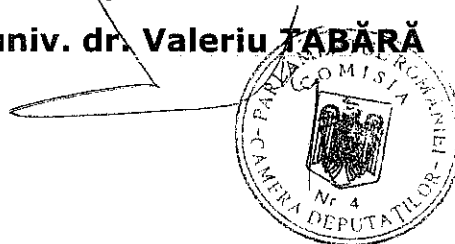

The Common Agricultural Policy after 2013

Conference "CAP post-2013", Brussels, 19-20/07/2010

On 12 April 2010 Commissioner Ciolos launched an extensive debate across the EU to seek views of both stakeholders and society at large on the future of the Common Agricultural Policy, its objectives, principles and contribution to the 'Europe 2020' strategy to inform the preparatory work for the decision-making process.

Some of the key points to address are how the CAP can be adapted to better meet the challenges on food security, climate change, growth and jobs, respond to market trends, and address the expectations of society concerning public goods and the environment.

The aim of the conference is to bring together the varied elements of contributions presented during the debate period and to provide the opportunity for further discussion around the following broad themes:

- Why do we need a common agricultural policy?
- What do citizens expect from agriculture?
- Why reform the CAP?
- What tools do we need for the CAP of tomorrow?

The conference will also be an important step in the Commission's preparations for a Communication to be issued later in the year that will prepare the ground for proposals for the CAP post-2013.

The conference will be opened by Dacian Ciolos, Commissioner responsible for Agriculture and Rural Development, who will also chair the plenary sessions.

The programme will include the following topics:

- Public opinion on the CAP (results of the Eurobarometer survey) and the public contribution to the debate on the CAP post-2013;
- panel discussions with leading experts, representatives from think tanks, stakeholders and NGOs, representatives of the food chain and European institutions;
- workshops and open debates dedicated to food security, maintaining EU food production capacity, provision of public goods through agriculture, preserving the environment and the countryside, maintaining the viability of rural areas, promoting quality and diversity of food, nutrition and health.
