Propunem:

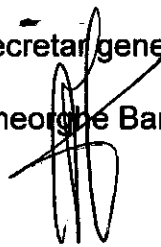
- să se aprobe participarea domnului deputat Georgian Pop;

The Open Ukraine Foundation of Arseniy Yatseniuk presents its compliments and has the honour to invite you to its 4th Kyiv Security Forum, entitled "Changing the Security Paradigm in a Fragmented World. European Dimension", to be held on November 11-12, 2010 in Kyiv.

It will be a great pleasure if you would agree to speak at the session entitled "Black Sea Geopolitics: Dilemmas and Prospects" on the second day of the Forum (a draft agenda is attached).

The Kyiv Security Forum is held annually since 2007. It is the region's foremost platform for high level discussions on the most pressing security issues in the Black Sea region and wider Europe.

This year the Forum will take place in the midst of major policy debates that are shaping the future of European and global security. New threats are emerging alongside hard security concerns with which Europe is still struggling to cope. Today's outdated security systems and paradigms are poorly equipped in the face of new dangers, meanwhile power struggles deepen the security gaps. That is why we encourage open and informal discussions among politicians, experts, academics, journalists, civil society leaders and representatives of international organizations to lay down the basis for new approaches to European security.

Over 300 participants from more than 20 countries are expected to attend the Forum. Top government officials and policy leaders will address the public in plenary sessions, while recognized experts, politicians and academics will engage in vigorous debates during break-out sessions.

The Forum will be carried out in partnership with Chatham House (UK). Key financial support is provided by the Victor Pinchuk Foundation.

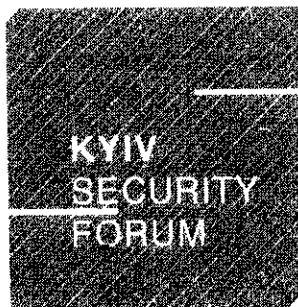
