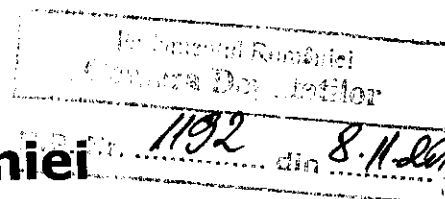
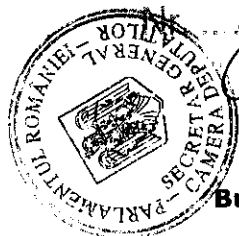

(Bruxelles, 30 noiembrie a.c.)**

Miercuri, 30 noiembrie 2011, domnul **deputat Dan Radu Zătreanu (Grupul parlamentar al PD-L)**, membru al Comisiei pentru politică externă a Camerei Deputaților, a fost invitat să participe la reuniunea „Evaluarea indicatorilor cheie în Balcani”, organizată de Fundația Prietenii Europei, la Bruxelles.

Scopul acestei reuniuni îl constituie dezbateră evoluției statelor din Balcani la 20 de ani după disoluția fostei Iugoslavii, principalele subiecte fiind starea democrației, dezvoltarea mediului pentru investiții, perspectivele de aderare la Uniunea Europeană și progresul în aplicarea principiilor statului de drept.

La acest eveniment au fost invitate personalități la cel mai înalt nivel din guvernele, parlamentele, mediul de afaceri și mediul academic din statele membre UE și din statele balcanice, precum și reprezentanți ai Comisiei și ai Parlamentului European. În proiectul de program sunt prevăzute intervenții ale președintelui Republicii Serbia, domnul Boris Tadić, ministrului afacerilor externe al Republicii Slovenia, domnul Samuel Žbogar, vicepreședintelui Băncii Europene pentru Investiții, domnului Dario Scannapieco, procurorului Tribunalului Penal pentru Fosta Iugoslavie, domnul Serge Brammertz, procurorului general al Republicii Albania, doamna Ina Rama.

Acțiunea are caracter parlamentar conform art. 3, alin. e, al HBP 1/2003, modificată și completată prin HBP 5/2007.

Propunem:

- să se aprobe participarea domnului deputat Dan Radu Zătreanu la acțiunea menționată;
- deplasarea să se efectueze cu avionul, pe ruta București – Bruxelles și retur, cu plecare în data de 29 noiembrie 2011, ora 16.30 (RO 373) și întoarcere în data de 1 decembrie 2011, ora 14.00 (RO 372);
- să se acorde drepturi de diurnă categoria a II-a pentru 2 zile, cazare plafon B pentru 2 nopți, precum și un avans de 50% cu decontare ulterioară;
- recalcularea cheltuielilor se facă la întoarcerea în țară, pe baza documentelor justificative.

WHAT, WHERE & WHEN:

The summit will provide a platform to debate the "state of play" twenty years from the dissolution of federal Yugoslavia. It will assess the region's democratic progress, how the investment climate has evolved, EU membership prospects and what candidate countries can bring to the EU, as well as progress in applying the rule of law.

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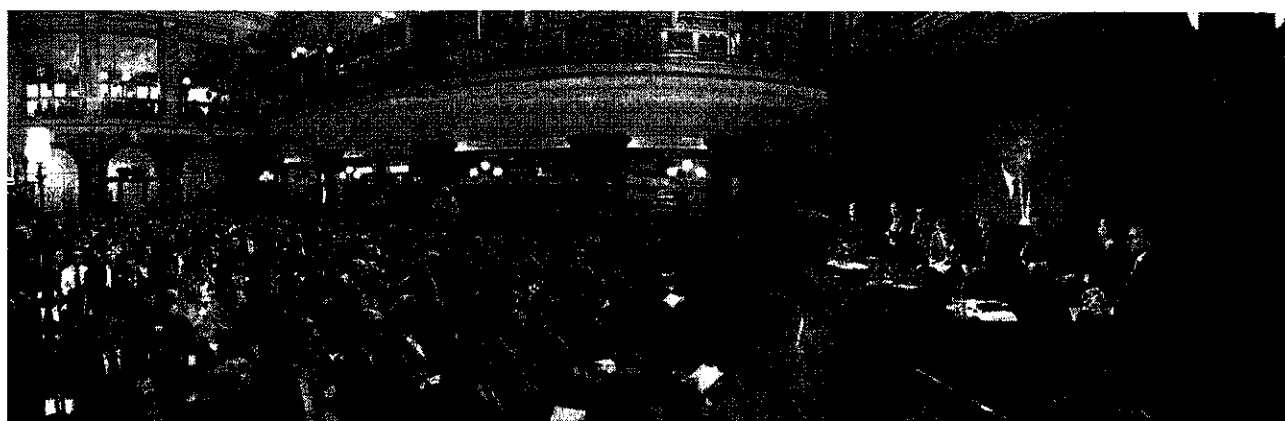
In the two decades since federal Yugoslavia's formal dissolution, how well have the countries it once grouped fared in terms of their democratic progress? And how significant are the signs that of late they have been cooperating more closely? *The Economist* coined the term "Yugosphere" in 2009 to describe the economic and cultural integration of western Balkan countries, but how real are their links and to what degree is a common marketplace beginning to emerge? What are governments in the region doing to address such serious structural problems as declining educational standards and the demographic pressures that are reducing active workforces while increasing dependants? Although Balkan governments have promised tough market reforms in the hopes of attracting post-recession inward investment, and agree on the need for sharing greatly improved infrastructure, which of them has progressed beyond merely paying lip service to these pledges? And what successes can the Sarajevo-based Regional Cooperation Council point to in its effort to make the western Balkans more economically dynamic?

IS THE EU STILL EAGER FOR MORE ENLARGEMENT?

Europe's "Big Bang" enlargement during 2004-6 brought in 10 new members, and now Croatia is set to raise the EU total to 28 in mid-2013. But is the Union's appetite for western Balkan members still as keen as ever, or have Greece's economic woes sparking the eurozone debt crisis begun to sour that enthusiasm? Can Serbia's efforts to accelerate its candidacy expect a boost from the arrests on war crimes charges of former Generals Ratko Mladić and Goran Hadžić, or are such efforts hindered by recent trade tensions between Serbia and Kosovo¹? Are various political imbroglios now affecting Albania, Bosnia and the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia alerting policymakers across the EU to the region's persistent stability problems? What progress towards eventual accession have Balkan countries achieved this year, and how do EU analysts now gauge their prospects? What do Balkan candidate countries believe they would contribute to the EU and the "European project"?

More than a decade of post-conflict development has done much to transform the western Balkans and instil a greater sense of progress and tolerance.
