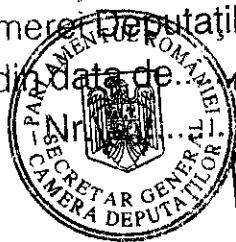

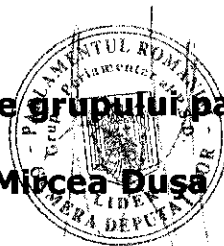

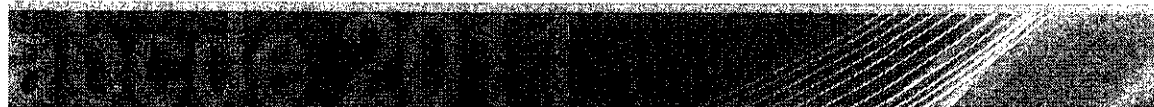
Accommodation
