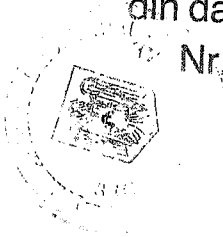

RAPORT

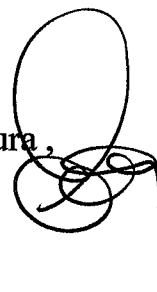

Legislators working worldwide to combat climate change

Dear Sir or Madam,

I'm writing to express my sincere thanks for your recent attendance at the Climate Parliament Forum, **International Cooperation for the Renewable Revolution**, in the European Parliament last week. As I'm sure you'll agree, the conference was a great success.

Some sixty MPs from across Africa, Asia and Europe were joined by high-level representatives of some of the world's largest multilateral and bi-lateral aid agencies, international investment banks and development NGOs. The list of participating agencies was impressive - represented at the Forum were the African Development Bank, the European Commission, the European Investment Bank, the European Bank of Reconstruction and Development, the Islamic Development Bank, the International Energy Agency, the International Renewable Energy Agency, the OECD, the Taiwanese Ministry for Economic Affairs, the United Nations Development Programme, and the United Nations Environment Programme - not to mention the numerous charities, non-profits and research groups who came and contributed their invaluable expertise and experience to the discussions. **Whichever agency, parliament or organisation you represented, I'd like to extend my warmest thanks for your help in making our Forum such a stimulating one.**

The quality of the presentations - not to mention the discussion and debate in both plenary sessions and regional break out groups - was of a uniformly high calibre; perhaps unsurprising when you consider the erudition and experience of the participants. Rarely have I felt myself surrounded by such a wealth of knowledge on the vital issues of renewable energy, climate change and development. Copies of the presentations are already available on the Climate Parliament website (climateparliament.eu), and photos and a full written report will be added in the coming weeks.

Innumerable different topics were covered over the course of the two days, and I cannot hope in such a short note to do justice to them all. But I hope you will indulge me if I spell out some of the personal conclusions that I have drawn from the presentations, conversations and debates of last week.

Firstly, the Forum reaffirmed a fact that I have heard from numerous energy experts: **renewable energy is already close to out-competing fossil fuels on the open market.** Indeed, in some parts of the world, it already does so. Analysts believe that a five-year policy push could get renewable energy to the point where it could outcompete fossil fuels on price - without subsidies. **All that is required is political will.**
