Tema: Participarea la workshop-ul cu tema „Pachetul pentru frontiere inteligente: provocările europene, experiențele naționale și calea de urmat”, organizat de Comisia pentru libertăți civile, justiție și afaceri interne (LIBE) din cadrul Parlamentului European (Bruxelles, 23-24 februarie 2015)

În data de 23-24 februarie 2015, Comisia pentru libertăți civile, justiție și afaceri interne (LIBE) din cadrul Parlamentului European va organiza la Bruxelles un workshop cu tema „Pachetul pentru frontiere inteligente: provocările europene, experiențele naționale și calea de urmat”.

La acest eveniment vor participa domnul Krum GARKOV, directorul Agenției Europene pentru Gestionarea Operațională a Sistemelor Informatice la Scară Largă (eu-LISA), domnul Rob ROZENBURG, șeful departamentului tehnic privind rezultatele studiului asupra frontierelor inteligente de la Comisia Europeană, domnul Giovanni BUTTARELLI, Controlor european pentru protecția datelor (EDPS) precum și domnul Claude MORAES, președintele comisiei LIBE a Parlamentului European.

Dezbaterile se vor axa, în principal, pe nevoia de a implementa un pachet pentru frontiere inteligente. Intenția organizatorilor este aceea de a realiza un schimb de opinii asupra necesității sistemului intrări/ieșiri (EEP) și implementării unui program de înregistrare a călătorilor (RTP), scopurile și caracteristicile sistemelor, provocări pentru diferite tipuri de frontiere și un exercițiu de simulare asupra conceptului de frontiere inteligente.

La aceasta acțiune va participa doamna deputat **Ana Birchall (PSD)**, Președinte al Comisiei pentru afaceri europene și membru în Comisia specială comună a Camerei Deputaților și Senatului pentru aderarea României la spațiul Schengen. Doamna deputat va modera a doua sesiune având ca temă: exercițiul de simulare asupra conceptului de „frontiere inteligente”.

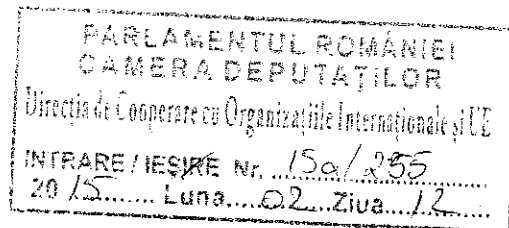
Acțiunea are caracter parlamentar conform art. 3, alin. c, al HBPr 1/2003, modificată și completată prin HBPr 5/2007.

Propunem:

- să se aprobe participarea doamnei deputat Ana Birchall la acțiunea menționată;
- deplasarea să se efectueze cu avionul, pe ruta București - Bruxelles - București, cu plecare în data de 22 februarie 2015, ora 16:50 (RO 373), și întoarcere în data de 24 februarie 2015, ora 23:05 (RO 374), conform traseului anexat;
- să se acorde drepturi de diurnă categoria a II-a, pentru 2½ zile, majorată cu 20%, conform art. 27, alin 2, lit. a, din HBPr 1/2003 cu modificările și completările ulterioare din HBPr 5/2007;
- să se acorde drepturi de cazare plafon B pentru 2 nopți, precum și un avans de 50% cu decontare ulterioară;
- decontarea cheltuielilor se va face la întoarcerea în țară, pe baza documentelor justificative.

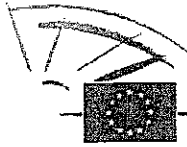

To the Chairperson(s) of the committee(s) concerned

Honourable Chairperson,

In February 2013 the European Commission presented the legislative proposals comprising together the Smart Borders Package. This package consists of two main elements: the proposal for an Entry/Exit System (COM(2013)95) which would record the time and place of entry and exit of third-country nationals crossing the external borders, calculate the duration of their stay as well as generate an alert when authorised periods for stay have expired and the proposal for a Registered Traveller Programme (COM(2013)97) which would allow certain groups of frequent travellers (i.e. business travellers, family members etc.) from third countries to enter the Union, subject to appropriate pre-screening, using simplified border checks including at automated gates.

The Committee on Civil Liberties, Justice and Home Affairs has been discussing these proposals since then and during the last legislative term identified a number of serious concerns in the proposals presented. These concerns and concerns expressed by Member States in the Council as well as by the Commission led to a further technical study. This study was presented in our Committee on 16 October 2014 by the Commission. On 3 December Commissioner Avramopoulos announced to the Committee that the proposals of 2013 would be withdrawn and replaced by new proposals at the end of 2015 or the beginning of 2016.

Against this background, the Committee on Civil Liberties, Justice and Home Affairs would like to invite Members of national Parliaments to an inter-parliamentary meeting on *"The Smart Borders Package: European challenges, national experiences, the way ahead."* The meeting is scheduled for Monday, 23 February 2015, from 3 p.m. to 6.30 p.m. and Tuesday, 24 February from 9 a.m. to 12.30 in the European Parliament in Brussels.

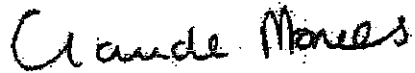

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Following the concerns raised by Parliament and Council about the 2013 legislative proposals the Commission launched a proof of concept exercise aimed at identifying options for implementing the Smart Borders package. This exercise consists of two stages:

1. A Commission-led Technical Study aimed at identifying and assessing the most suitable and promising options and solutions.
2. Testing entrusted to the Agency for the Operational Management of large-scale IT Systems in the area of Freedom, Security and Justice (eu-LISA), aimed at verifying the feasibility of the

options identified in the Technical Study and validating the selected concepts for both automated and manual border controls.

The session is intended to provide a comprehensive overview of the state of play of the "proof of concept" and allow for an exchange of views on it.

The Commission proposed, however, that the first evaluation of the system two years after the start of operation would "specifically examine the contribution the [EES] could make in the fight against terrorist offences and other serious criminal offences and will deal with the issue of access for law enforcement [...]". (Art. 46(5)) Member States, however, seem to favour such an access from the start. This session aims to discuss the idea of law enforcement access in all aspects.
