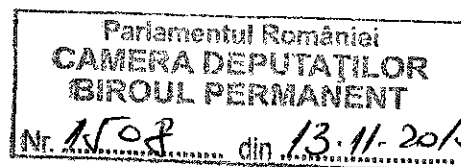

MEMORANDUM INTERN

Tema: Participarea la seminarul Grupului special al AP NATO pentru Mediterana și Orientul Mijlociu și la Forumul anual al Parlamentarilor pentru Acțiune Globală (Florența, 26-27 noiembrie și San Salvador 30 noiembrie-1 decembrie 2015)

Adunarea parlamentară a NATO organizează în perioada 26-27 noiembrie 2015, la Florența, un seminar al Grupului special pentru Mediterana și Orientul Mijlociu.

Seminarul va fi consacrat dezbaterii multiplelor aspecte securitare și economice legate de această regiune: Dimensiunea umanitară și diplomatică a crizei refugiaților; Originile ideologice, teologice și socio-economice ale terorismului jihadist; Relațiile Europei cu Orientul Mijlociu; Finanțarea grupărilor teroriste; Perspectivile sectorului energetic în Orientul Mijlociu și Nordul Africii; Statutul femeilor în această regiune; Libia între statalitate și război civil; Rusia, Iranul și ordinea regională în curs de apariție. Parlamentul României va fi reprezentat de domnul deputat **Gabriel Vlase** (PSD), vicepreședinte al Camerei Deputaților și șef al delegației parlamentare române la AP NATO.

În continuare, domnul deputat Gabriel Vlase va participa la Forumul anual al Parlamentarilor pentru Acțiune Globală, organizat în perioada 30 noiembrie-1 decembrie 2015 la San Salvador.

Dezbaterile vor fi axate pe două teme majore – aplicarea Tratatului privind comerțul cu arme și Convenția privind armele biologice și toxice – și rolul parlamentelor în promovarea păcii și a securității.

Acțiunile au caracter parlamentar, conform Art. 3, alineatele a) și e) din HBPR 1/2003, modificată și completată prin HBPR 5 /2007.

Propunem:

- să se aprobe participarea domnului deputat Gabriel Vlase la seminarului Grupului special pentru Mediterana și Orientul Mijlociu și la Forumul anual al Parlamentarilor pentru Acțiune Globală;

- deplasarea să se facă cu avionul, clasa business, pe ruta București-Paris-Florența-Amsterdam-Panama-San Salvador-Mexico-Paris-București, cu plecare în ziua de 25 noiembrie, ora 9.15 (AF 5049) și întoarcere în ziua de 3 decembrie, ora 20.10 (AF 5050);

- să se acorde cazare plafon B, pentru 3 nopți în Florența și pentru 2 nopți în San Salvador, la hotelurile recomandate de organizatori, precum și 1 noapte în Amsterdam; menționăm că domnul deputat nu solicită cazare și diurnă pentru ziua suplimentară de deplasare în Mexic;

- să se acorde drepturi de diurnă pentru 7 ½ zile categoria a II-a, 100%, majorată cu 20% conform Art. 27 alin. (2) lit. a) din HBPR nr. 1/2003, cu modificările și completările din HBPR nr. 5/2007;

- să se acorde un avans de 30% cu decontare ulterioară din care să se suporte și eventualele taxe de oraș sau sejur;

- să se suporte din bugetul Camerei Deputaților cheltuielile privind asigurările de călătorie în perioada efectivă de deplasare;

- decontarea cheltuielilor să se facă la întoarcerea în țară pe baza documentelor justificative.

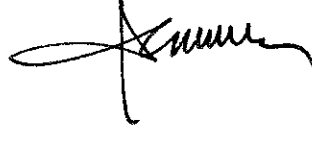

We are pleased to inform you that PGA, with the kind cooperation of the Parliament of El Salvador, will hold its 37th Annual Parliamentary Forum in San Salvador from 30 November to 1 December on the topic of "The Role of Parliamentarians in Promoting Peace and Security". An official invitation has been sent to the Speaker of your parliament by the hosting Legislative Assembly kindly inquiring formation of an official delegation to be sent to represent your parliament at the Forum. We would, therefore, exhort you to reach out to and encourage your Speaker to compose and send such a delegation in which you may request to be included. In anticipation of the forum, we are delighted to share a mid-year update on PGA's Peace and Democracy Program and invite you to take actions in favor of the Arms Trade Treaty.

The update comprises the following sections:

1. PGA Global Parliamentary Campaign for Universality and Implementation of the Arms Trade Treaty
2. Other Initiatives by PGA Members in support of Peace and Security.

I. PGA GLOBAL PARLIAMENTARY CAMPAIGN FOR UNIVERSALITY AND IMPLEMENTATION OF THE ARMS TRADE TREATY

Since the launch of its Global Parliamentary Campaign for Signature and Ratification of the Arms Trade Treaty which became, with the entry into force of the ATT on 24 December last year, Campaign for Universality and Implementation of the ATT, PGA Members worldwide have made tremendous contributions leading to 44 signatures among the 130 UN Member States that have signed the ATT and 28 ratifications in the 72 UN Member States that have ratified it to date.

For the past semester, PGA and its network of parliamentarians have advocated for the ATT in 38 countries including *Angola, Austria, Bangladesh, Benin, Brazil, Cameroon, Canada, Cape Verde, Central African Republic, Chad, Comoros, Congo (Democratic Republic of), Cook Islands, Côte d'Ivoire, Dominican Republic, Fiji, Gabon, Ghana, Guinea-Bissau, Guatemala, Honduras, Kenya, Kiribati, Liberia, Malaysia, Maldives, Mauritania, Mauritius, Mozambique, Pakistan, Papua New Guinea, Peru, Solomon Islands, Sri Lanka, Tanzania, Togo, Tonga, Tuvalu and Vanuatu.*

Among its achievements for the past 6 months, PGA has recorded the ratification of the ATT by Côte d'Ivoire, Liberia and Chad and expect the number to significantly increase as we are approaching this year UN Special Treaty Event 2015 to be held during the next session of the UN General Assembly in September.

As part of the same campaign, PGA with the kind cooperation of the Legislative Assembly of Tonga organized and hosted in Nuku'alofa from 18-19 May, 2015 a Regional Pacific Islands Parliamentary Workshop to Promote Universality and Implementation of the Arms Trade Treaty. The Workshop brought together MPs from

8 countries in the region together for two days in Nuku'alofa/Tonga in order to identify hurdles, challenges and solutions in terms of moving the ATT ratification/accession and implementation processes forward across the region.

The Workshop benefited from the presence of a regional expert and PGA expert staff who briefed more fully on the technical/legal aspects of the ATT, as well as shared and discussed the PGA Parliamentary Handbook and PGA Parliamentary Tool Kit on the Arms Trade Treaty.

A specific Panel Discussion was dedicated exclusively to reviewing the important gender component of the ATT and how it may be most effectively enforced in implementing the ATT in the region. The Workshop was kindly supported by the

United Nations Trust Facility Supporting Cooperation on Arms Regulation (UNSCAR).

In execution of the plan of actions adopted by the participants at conclusion of the Workshop, **Hon. Aide Ganasi, Deputy Speaker of Parliament of Papua New Guinea** and PGA Member, initiated a parliamentary question to his Foreign Minister inquiring when Papua New Guinea will honor its international commitment of ratifying

the ATT. In response to the question, Hon. Rimbink Pato MP, Minister for Foreign Affairs and Immigration assured Hon. Aide Ganasi MP of the PNG Government's commitment to ratify the ATT following completion of review process. [Click here](#) to read more.

In the same chapter, **Hon. Su'a William Sio, Chair of PGA's New Zealand National Group** who also participated in the Workshop, called on Fijian Parliamentarians to push for ratification of the ATT when attending the Fijian Parliamentarians Forum on the sustainable development goals in June 2015.
