Tema: Participarea la Summit-ul 2015 din Europa Centrală și de Est privind gazele de șist și țițeiul (Varșovia, 9 - 10 martie 2015)

În perioada 9 - 10 martie 2015, se va desfășura „Summit-ul 2015 din Europa Centrală și de Est privind gazele de șist și țițeiul” în Varșovia, Polonia.

Evenimentul reprezintă o platformă de dezbateri în cadrul căruia vor fi analizate oportunitățile și provocările actuale și viitoare în industria gazelor de șist.

În prima zi de lucrări vor fi discutate aspecte legate de Polonia, Danemarca și Germania, în domenii precum analizarea legislației în domeniu, stadiul actual și dezvoltarea exploatarei gazelor de șist.

În cea de-a doua zi vor avea loc discuții privind exploatarea gazelor de șist în România, Ucraina și Lituania urmând a fi analizate provocările din punct de vedere geologic, precum și rolul gazelor de șist în contextul energetic general.

Cu această ocazie vor fi prezentate numeroase studii de caz privind gazele de șist în Europa Centrală și de Est, punându-se accent pe aspectul tehnologic inovator.

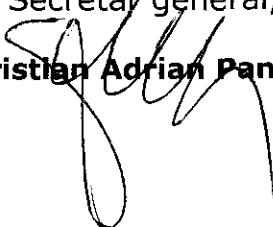

Central and Eastern Europe Shale Gas & Oil Summit 2015 is a two-day conference and exhibition serving as a platform to reinvigorate European shale gas exploration. The conference will also incorporate numerous case studies covering existing experience within the Central and Eastern European shale gas sector, with particular attention being paid to encouraging much-needed technological innovation within the sector.

The conference will also feature a two-day exhibition attended by market-leaders within the Shale Gas sector. The exhibition is an opportunity for companies to showcase their products or services towards current or potential clients and provide opportunities for further general networking.

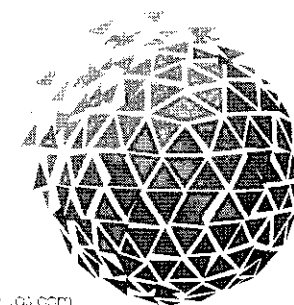

SESSION 1 – THE FUTURE OF SHALE GAS IN CENTRAL EUROPE

9:00-10:00 Panel Discussion – The Future of Shale Gas in Central Europe

This panel discussion will consider the different perspectives on achieving actual, large-scale extraction of shale in Central Europe. Topics such as performance optimization, incentives for both government and investors to back shale exploration, and the question of where the industry will be within the next 5 years, will be considered.

10:00-10:30 Morning Networking Break

SESSION 2 – POLAND

10:30-11:00 Ministry of the Environment Poland on Shale Gas Presentation

This presentation will consider the Ministry of the Environment Poland's current stance on shale gas within Poland. Questions such as 'why has progress in Poland been so much slower than shale efforts elsewhere?', 'How can we speed-up shale progress in Poland?' and 'What do the Ministry hope to see over the coming years for Polish shale?' will be considered.

11:00-11:30 Navigating the Polish Regulatory Regime Presentation

This session will consider ways to navigate the new regulatory regime in Poland in order to maximise opportunity. Discussion topics including PGNIG's role in maximising shale gas prospects in Poland, the road to a commercially viable Polish shale industry, and the 6 year tax free exploration period will be considered.

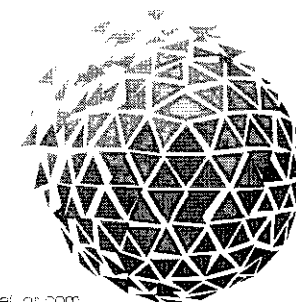
11:30-12:00 Cleaner & Cheaper Development Presentation

This presentation will focus upon methods for achieving cleaner and cheaper development of shale gas within Poland. Key topics will include whether the cost to produce Polish shale is decreasing and how companies can implement more efficient operations.

12:00-12:30 Operator Experience with Polish Shale Presentation

This session will provide an insight into Polish shale gas from those operators currently active within the region. Key discussion topics will include how to optimise drilling, design and operations, the difficulties of accessing Polish shale, supply chain management and infrastructure, maximising production from new wells, and what are the likely quantities of recoverable Polish shale based on existing project feedback.

SESSION 3 - DENMARK

13:30-14:00 Reviewing Recent Investment and Development in Denmark Presentation

This presentation will consider recent investment trends within Denmark combined with development updates. Operator experience, approaches for introducing an economically viable shale gas industry in Denmark and the financial viability of the sector will be discussed.

14:00-14:30 Role of Shale to Energy Self-Sufficiency in Denmark Presentation

This session will evaluate the Danish Energy Agency stance toward shale gas within Denmark. Attention will be paid to the role that shale can play to energy self-sufficiency in Denmark, regulation and the place of shale within the energy mix.

14:30-15:00 Environmental Impacts of Shale Presentation

This session will consider the environmental impacts associated with shale production and best practice for trying to reduce the physical footprint of operations. Discussion will focus upon surface pollution, "flowback water", water and waste management, the need for environmental impact assessment, and safe technologies.

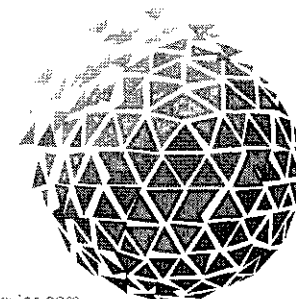

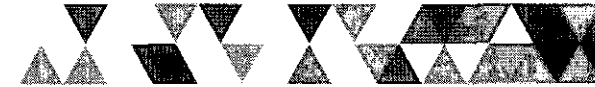
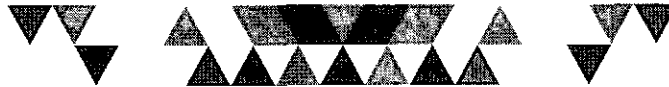
SESSION 4 - GERMANY

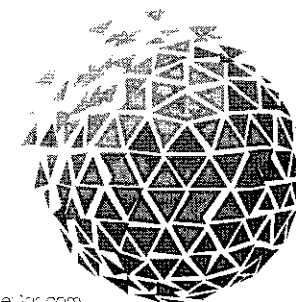
SESSION 2 - ROMANIA

11:00-11:30 Romanian Ministry Perspective on Shale Gas Presentation

This session will consider the stance of the Romanian Ministry toward the shale gas industry. Attention will be paid to the desire for energy independence, working with operators to progress the industry, and government initiatives designed to overcome opposition to shale gas exploration.

11:30-12:00 Addressing the Public Perception of Shale Gas within Romania Presentation

This session will consider the barrier that public perception is creating to exploration within Romania and different approaches for improving community relations. Focus will be placed upon transparency with local communities, social impact assessments, reducing impacts, combatting industry misrepresentation, and the latest measures enacted to ensure local communities are not hindered by shale gas production.





12:00-12:30 Navigating the Romanian Investment Landscape Presentation

This presentation will evaluate the current investment landscape within Romania. Discussion will consider the current operator environment, estimates of recoverable shale gas reserves within Romania, the extent to which public perception is deterring investment in Romania, and approaches for generating an economically viable Romanian shale gas industry.

12:30-13:30 Lunch

SESSION 3 - UKRAINE

13:30-14:00 The Role of Shale to Ukraine's Energy Mix Presentation

This presentation will focus upon the role that shale gas could play to Ukrainian energy security. Discussion will consider the relationship between shale and Ukrainian energy independence, the extent of Ukraine's shale gas reserves and the government stance toward full scale exploration within Ukraine.

14:00-14:30 Assessing the Impact of the Ukrainian Crisis on the Country's Shale Gas Industry Presentation

With shale operations drastically reduced in Ukraine in the wake of the diplomatic crisis that took place earlier this year this session aims to navigate the lasting impact of this crisis and the repercussions it will hold to Ukrainian shale gas potential.

14:30-15:00 The Future of Shale within the Ukraine Presentation

This session will consider the future of the Ukrainian shale gas industry. Attention will be afforded to plans for exploration in Ukraine over the next 2 years and the changing investment landscape associated with the industry.

15:00-15:30 Afternoon Networking Break

SESSION 4 - LITHUANIA

15:30-16:00 Evaluating Lithuania's Investment Potential Presentation

This session will consider the existing investment landscape within Lithuania. Attention will be paid to the new government stance toward the shale gas industry, navigating legal framework, the new investor-friendly tax regime and trends within Lithuania's shale gas sector.

16:00-16:30 Existing and Future Plans for Exploration within Lithuania Presentation

This presentation will consider existing and prospective plans for exploration within Lithuania. The viability of Lithuanian shale gas, estimates for recoverable shale gas reserves and operator perspective on Lithuania will be considered.
