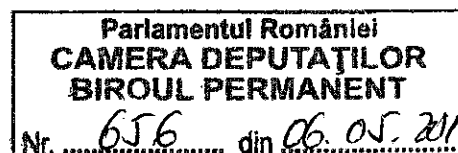

**Tema: Participarea la Forumul Global al Comitetului Evreiesc – AJC -
(Washington D.C., SUA, 7-9 iunie 2015)**

În perioada 7-9 iunie 2015, la Washington DC. în SUA, va avea loc Forumul Global al Comitetului American Evreiesc (AJC), la care a fost invitat să participe domnul deputat **Aurel Vainer** (Grupul parlamentar al minorităților naționale), în calitate sa de membru al Camerei Deputaților și de președinte al Federației Comunităților Evreiești din România.

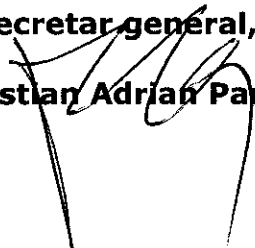
Comitetul American al Evreilor (AJC) este una dintre cele mai vechi organizații de promovare a evreilor din Statele Unite, creată în anul 1906 cu scopul de a asigura bunăstarea și securitatea evreilor din întreaga lume.

Programul forumului de la Washington din acest an include reuniuni plenare și workshop-uri ce vor avea în dezbatere teme precum: *Israel într-o Europă în schimbare; marcarea existenței națiunii: extinderea dezbaterilor despre Israel; rolul Israelului la Pacific: deschiderea către Asia; prioritățile politicii AJC; marcarea a 50 de ani de la Revoluția Iudeo-Creștină*, etc.

Acțiunea are caracter parlamentar conform art. 3, lit. e) din HBP 1/2003 modificată și completată prin HBP 5/2007.

Propunem:

- să se aprobe participarea domnului deputat Aurel Vainer la această acțiune;
- deplasarea să se efectueze cu avionul, clasa business, pe ruta București-Istanbul-Washington și retur pe ruta New York-Istanbul-București, cu plecare în data de 5 iunie a.c., ora 10.05, zbor TK 1044 și întoarcere în data de 12 iunie a.c., ora 09.05, zbor TK 1043. Menționăm că transportul pe ruta Washington-New York, va fi suportat de către domnul deputat, conform solicitării anexate.
- să se acorde drepturi de diurnă categoria a II-a, 100%, pentru 4 zile, cazare pentru 4 nopți, la hotelul recomandat de către organizatori, precum și un avans de 20% cu decontare ulterioară. Menționăm că pentru zilele de 5, 10 și 11 iunie a.c., deputat Aurel Vainer nu solicită diurnă, conform adresei anexate.
- recalcularea cheltuielilor se va face la întoarcerea în țară, pe baza documentelor justificative.

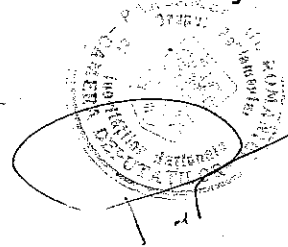

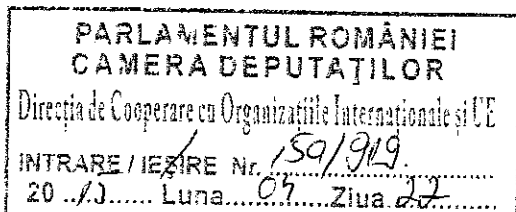

Latin America One Year After the Gaza War

A SESSION BY AJC'S ARTHUR AND ROCHELLE BELFER INSTITUTE FOR LATINO AND LATIN AMERICAN AFFAIRS

Last summer was a trying time for Israel-Latin American relations. While Israel fought back against a barrage of Hamas rockets and the threat of terror tunnels from Gaza, five Latin American countries recalled their ambassadors and harshly criticized the Jewish State. And yet Latin America remains important, given the presence of influential Jewish communities and the

deep engagement of the neighboring U.S. Dina Siegel Vann, Director of AJC's Belfer Institute for Latino and Latin American Affairs, and Ambassador Tom Shannon, Counselor of the Department at the U.S. State Department, will discuss the crucial question: where do we go from here?

Muslim-Jewish Relations: The Next Interreligious Frontier

The recent Pew projection that by 2050 there will be more Muslims in the U.S. than Jews reflects a powerful truth of interreligious work: while Christian-Jewish relations were at the forefront in the 20th century, we must now turn our attention to Muslim-Jewish dialogue. Join Rabbi Noam Marans, AJC's Director of Interreligious and Intergroup Relations, and Zainab Al-Suwaij, Executive Director of the American Islamic Congress, to learn more about future relations between these two Abrahamic faiths.

Quiet Border No More: ISIS & Al-Qaeda on the Golan

Though Israel and Syria have been in a declared state of war for decades, Israel's border with Syria was long one of its quietest. But that peaceful period seems to have come to an end. The Syrian Civil War—with the involvement of ISIS and the Al-Qaeda-linked Al-Nusra Front—rages just over the Golan Heights ceasefire line. And while countless world leaders have said that President Assad must go and that his ouster is only a matter of time, the carnage in Syria continues. In this session, Robert Ford, former U.S. Ambassador to Syria, will share his perspective on this dire and dangerous state of affairs.

Understanding Statecraft

Members of Israel's foreign service have some of the toughest jobs in the world. They must make the case for the Jewish State in every corner of the globe, not just to friendly allies but also to indifferent and sometimes hostile audiences. H.E. Daniel Taub is Israel's Ambassador to the Court of St. James's. He was extensively involved in Israeli negotiations with the Palestinians and with Syria. On the basis of his years of experience, he developed and taught training programs for Israeli diplomats in negotiation strategies and communications skills. Learn the tips of the trade from a true master and seasoned practitioner.

Nostra Aetate: 50 Years of Christian-Jewish Revolution

One of the most dramatic transformations of the past century was the revolution in Catholic teaching towards Jews and Judaism ushered in by the Second Vatican Council, first set out in the document "Nostra Aetate," promulgated exactly fifty years ago. In this session, Rabbi David Rosen, AJC's International Director of Interreligious Affairs, will put Nostra Aetate in its historic context, analyze its impact, and discuss its implications for interreligious dialogue today.

The Coming Storm: BDS on the American Campus

Many young American Jews (and their parents) worry that the best minds of their generation are being warped by the one-sided debate over Israel on college campuses. As anti-Israel hatred passes for liberalism, and a growing number of student governments vote to divest from Israel (with limited impact, so far), what are the best strategies—on campus and off—to stem the tide of the Boycott, Divestment, Sanctions (BDS) movement?

Through the Looking Glass: How the International Media Covers Israel

American Jews often criticize media coverage of the Middle East for its excessive and negative scrutiny of Israel. Matti Friedman, a former AP reporter out of Jerusalem, knows why news outlets all over the world botch the Israel story so horribly. He will share his insights, which cut straight to the heart of the Israeli-Arab conflict, at this session.

Turkey and Qatar: A Destabilizing Duo?

While nominally allied with the United States, Turkey and Qatar support and export extremism, and are leading patrons of Hamas and other terror groups. That raises serious questions: Can Qatar continue to host a major U.S. airbase and cooperate against terror while itself investing hundreds of millions of dollars in regional terrorism? What do the just-concluded parliamentary elections in Turkey presage for the country's fragile democracy? How can NATO cope with a member that increasingly challenges its democratic values and counter-terror strategy? The Washington Institute's Dr. Soner Cagaptay and Dr. Lori Plotkin Boghardt will discuss these questions and your own in this session.

U.S.- Israel Relations: Permanent Friends or Permanent Interests?

THE MAX FISHER ANNUAL LECTURE

Conventional wisdom has it that the U.S.-Israel relationship is at a new low, but is this really true? This session will explore the origins and development of U.S.-Israel relations since 1948. What have been the highs and lows? Where do things stand today? And where are they headed? Dr. Steven Bayme, director of AJC's Contemporary Jewish Life Department, will trace this fascinating history.

What India's Embrace of Israel Means for the Two Democracies

A SESSION BY AJC'S ASIA PACIFIC INSTITUTE

The world's largest democracy and its only Jewish one have been finding increasing common ground, and sharing face time, in recent months. Starting with a meeting between Prime Ministers Netanyahu and Modi at the opening of the UN General Assembly in September, and continuing through business deals and diplomatic tweets, Israel seems to be accomplishing its own pivot to Asia. Join Sadanand Dhume, resident fellow at the American Enterprise Institute, and Mark Sofer, former Israeli Ambassador to India and current Head of the Division for Asia and the Pacific in the Israeli Ministry of Foreign Affairs, for a look to the East.
