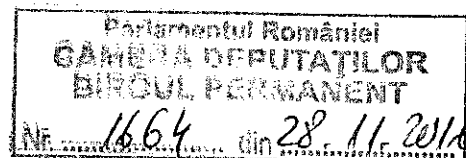

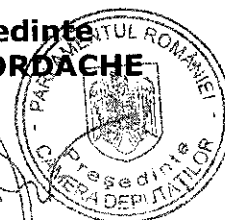

Tema: Participarea la întâlnirile inter-parlamentare organizate de Comisii ale Parlamentului European (Bruxelles, 28 - 29 noiembrie 2016)

În perioada 28 - 29 noiembrie 2016 la Bruxelles, vor avea loc întâlniri inter-parlamentare organizate de Comisia pentru afaceri constituționale (AFCO) și Comisia pentru libertăți civile, justiție și afaceri interne (LIBE) din cadrul Parlamentului European, la care sunt invitați să participe membri ai Parlamentelor naționale ale Statelor Membre UE.

În proiectul de program al Comisiei LIBE sunt prevăzute două sesiuni de dezbateră pe următoarele teme: Stabilirea cadrului pentru realizarea Uniunii Europene a apărării, rolul Europol în acest proces și exercitarea unui control parlamentar operațional și eficient al Europol. În cadrul lucrărilor vor lua cuvântul Comisarul pentru uniunea de securitate, domnul Julian King, Directorul EUROPOL, domnul Rob Wainwright și Președintele Comisiei pentru libertăți civile, justiție și afaceri interne, domnul Claude Moraes.

În proiectul de program al reuniunii Comisiei AFCO sunt prevăzute trei sesiuni de dezbateră pe următoarele teme: dreptul de anchetă al Parlamentului European; revizuirea legii electorale a Uniunii Europene; viitoarea evoluție instituțională a Uniunii Europene. În cadrul lucrărilor AFCO vor lua cuvântul Președintele Comisiei pentru afaceri constituționale, doamna Danuta Maria Hübner, Co-raportorii AFCO pe tema "Îmbunătățirea funcționării Uniunii Europene privind potențialul Tratatului de la Lisabona", doamna Mercedes Bresso și domnul Elmar Brok precum și raportorul AFCO pe tema "Evoluții posibile și ajustări la cadrul instituțional actual al Uniunii Europene", domnul Guy Verhofstadt.

Din partea Camerei Deputaților, la aceste reuniuni va participa domnul deputat **Alexandru Nazare (PNL)**, membru al Comisiei pentru afaceri europene.

Acțiunea are caracter parlamentar conform art. 3, lit. c, al HBP 1/2003 modificată și completată prin HBP 5/2007.

Propunem:

- să se aprobe participarea domnului deputat Alexandru Nazare la această acțiune;
- deplasarea să se efectueze cu avionul, pe ruta București – Bruxelles și retur, clasa economic, cu plecare în data de 28 noiembrie a.c., ora 07.20 (RO 371) și întoarcere în data de 30 noiembrie a.c., ora 14.00 (RO 372), conform traseului anexat;
- să se acorde drepturi de diurnă categoria a II-a, 100% pentru 2 ½ zile, cazare plafon B pentru două noți;
- să se suporte din bugetul Camerei Deputaților un avans de 20% cu decontare ulterioară și, totodată, să se suporte din acesta eventualele taxe de oraș percepute de hotel;
- să se suporte din bugetul Camerei Deputaților cheltuielile privind serviciile de asigurare contra accidentelor și asigurare de sănătate pentru perioada efectivă de deplasare;
- recalcularea cheltuielilor să se facă la întoarcerea în țară pe baza documentelor justificative.

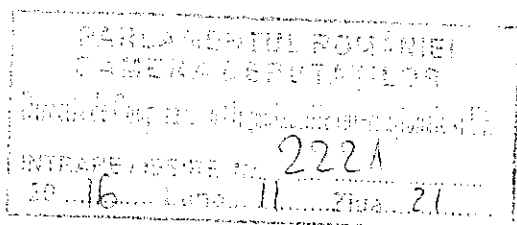

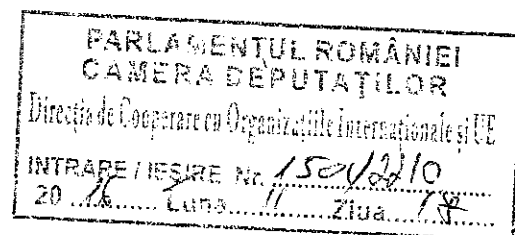
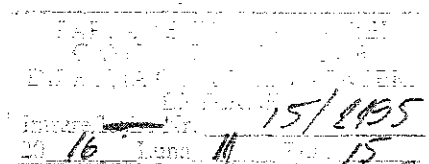

Honourable Chairperson,

On 11 May 2016, the new Europol Regulation (Regulation (EU) 2016/794) entered into force. In this Regulation, a Joint Parliamentary Scrutiny Group (JPSG) has been established to enable national Parliaments and the European Parliament, pursuant to Article 88 of the TFEU, to politically scrutinize Europol's activities. The Europol Regulation states that "the organisation and the rules of procedure of the JPSG shall be determined together by the European Parliament and the national parliaments in accordance with Article 9 of Protocol No 1".

In order for this new scrutiny body to be ready by the date of application of this new Europol Regulation (1 May 2017), the Conference of Speakers of the EU Parliaments in May 2016 agreed a step by step approach to define the modalities of the JPSG, which included an interparliamentary meeting to be organised by the LIBE committee at the European Parliament in autumn 2016.

Against this background, the Committee on Civil Liberties, Justice and Home Affairs would like to invite Members of national Parliaments to an inter-parliamentary meeting on "Europol and its parliamentary scrutiny in the framework of EU Internal Security policies". The meeting is scheduled for Monday 28 November 2016 from 15h00 to 18h30 in the European Parliament in Brussels.

I am therefore pleased to invite up to four Members of the relevant committee(s) from each national Parliament (two from each Chamber in the case of bi-cameral Parliaments) to attend this meeting.

Should you be unable to attend, I would welcome any written contribution which would be distributed to our respective Members and other participants.

Practical details regarding the meeting will be forwarded in due course to your Parliament's services for relations with the European Parliament.

I sincerely hope that you will be able to accept this invitation and I am looking forward to welcoming you to the European Parliament on 28 November 2016.

Subject: Interparliamentary Committee Meeting (ICM) on Tuesday 29 November

Dear Colleague,

I have the pleasure of inviting you for the Interparliamentary Committee meeting that the Constitutional Affairs Committee (AFCO) will organise on Tuesday 29 November.

We are all conscious of the enormous challenges that the European Union is facing, from the still palpable effects of the economic and financial crisis to the refugee crisis, or the threats to the security of citizens deriving from terrorism, not to mention the need to address the withdrawal of the United Kingdom and its consequences. Thus, it is crucial to discuss how the Union can best address those challenges in order to be able to carry on ensuring peace, security and prosperity for its citizens.

As the Heads of State and Government recently did in Bratislava, I believe that we, national and European parliamentarians should also exchange views on possible institutional consequences linked to such challenges. As such, I am proposing that a large part of our common discussions concentrate on the future institutional evolution of the European Union.

AFCO is currently dealing with two important reports that address this issue from a dual perspective, namely identifying what we can do together without changing the treaties (co-rapporteurs Mercedes Bresso and Elmar Brok)¹ and what actions would require treaty modifications (rapporteur Guy Verhofstadt)². The discussion on those two reports is programmed for the plenary session of the European Parliament in December. Our meeting would thus constitute a perfect occasion for a frank and open exchange on such institutional matters before the European Parliament takes a position on them. I propose that we dedicate the afternoon part of our meeting (from 15.00 to 17.15) to that discussion. At that occasion, we foresee independent contributions of two renowned experts on the matter to launch the debate.

Furthermore, two concrete and important legislative files, falling within the remit of the Committee on Constitutional Affairs are currently under discussion in the Council and have produced substantial observations by national Parliaments. They concern the proposal for a new regulation on the right of inquiry of the European Parliament³ and the proposal for the reform of the European electoral law⁴

on which national Parliaments will be called to give their approval once the legislative procedure at European level is completed.

I propose that we discuss those two files during the morning part of our common meeting, which will last from 10.00 to 12.30.

Between the morning and afternoon session, all the members participating in the meeting are cordially invited for lunch.

We are therefore very pleased to invite up to four Members of your corresponding committee(s) (two of each chamber in the case of bi-cameral Parliaments) to attend this meeting on **Tuesday 29 November 2016 from 10.00 am to 12.30 pm and from 15.00 pm to 17.30 pm**, on the premises of the European Parliament in Brussels.

You will find attached the draft programme that I am proposing at this stage.

In view of this meeting, or in the case that you and/or your Members are unable to attend, we would welcome any written contributions from your committee, which would also be distributed to the participants.

Practical details regarding the ICM will be forwarded in due course to your Parliament's Representatives/Services responsible for relations with the European Parliament.

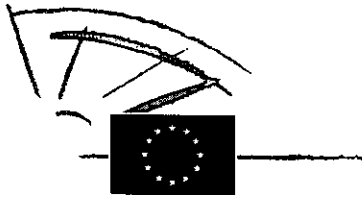
We sincerely hope that your committee will be able to accept our invitation and we are looking forward to welcoming you at the European Parliament on 29 November 2016.
