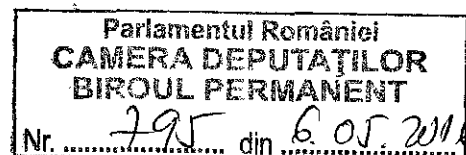

Tema: Participarea la primul Forum Global pentru Știință și Politică în cadrul programului celei de-a doua sesiuni a Adunării pentru Mediu a Națiunilor Unite (Nairobi, Kenya, 19-20 mai 2016)

În perioada 19-20 mai 2016, la Nairobi în Kenya, va avea loc primul Forum Global pentru Știință și Politică în cadrul programului celei de-a doua sesiuni a Adunării pentru Mediu a Națiunilor Unite, la care a fost invitat să participe domnul deputat **László Borbély** (UDMR), președintele Comisiei pentru politică externă a Camerei Deputaților.

Forumul reprezintă o oportunitate pentru comunitatea științifică și actorii decizionali din mediul politic pentru a se angaja într-un dialog constructiv pe tematici precum: știința și cunoștințele necesare asigurării unui cadru decizional informat asupra mediului înconjurător în contextul Agendei 2030 privind Dezvoltarea Durabilă.

Dezbaterile reuniunii vor fi organizate în sesiuni plenare și grupuri de lucru cu teme globale printre care menționăm: Înțelegerea provocărilor și noile oportunități referitoare la interconexiunea dintre știință și politică; Resursele: producția și consumul durabile; Resursele marine: identificarea căilor de acțiune și a informațiilor privind măsurile de prevenire a degradării oceanelor și zonelor de coastă, ca o condiție esențială pentru dezvoltarea durabilă; Conexiunea dintre alimente-energie-apă; capitalul natural; impactul sectorului extractiv; schimbările climatice, calitatea aerului, praful și furtunile de nisip; problematica frontalieră sub aspectul mediului înconjurător; Obiectivele de Dezvoltare Durabilă pe multiple nivele, tematici și domenii de activitate; punerea în evidență a evaluărilor privind GEO-6 la nivel regional și concluziile privind problematica de gen și mediul înconjurător la nivel global; Interconexiunea dintre știință și politică.

 - pentru doamna consilier parlamentar Sprenicz Kunigunda, diurnă pentru 4 zile și cazare plafon B pentru 3 nopți la hotelul recomandat de către organizatori, având în vedere orarul de zbor;
- să se acorde delegației un avans de 30% cu decontare ulterioară și, totodată, să se suporte din acesta eventuale alte taxe suplimentare precum taxele de oraș sau sejur percepute de hotel;
- să se suporte din bugetul Camerei Deputaților cheltuielile privind serviciile de asigurare contra accidentelor și asigurare de sănătate pentru perioada efectivă de deplasare;
- să se suporte din bugetul Camerei Deputaților suma de 2320 RON, reprezentând contravaloarea vaccinurilor, a tabletelor împotriva malariei, precum și a consultației medicale (970 RON pentru domnul deputat **László Borbély** și 1350 RON pentru doamna Sprenicz Kunigunda), necesare deplasării la Nairobi;
- decontarea cheltuielilor se va face la întoarcerea în țară, pe baza documentelor justificative.
