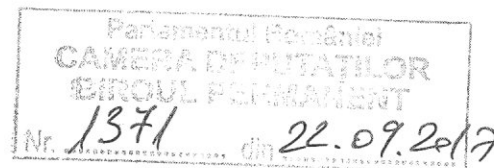

Tema: Participarea la workshop-ul parlamentar din marja reuniunii anuale a Grupului Băncii Mondiale și a Fondului Monetar Internațional (Washington D.C., 10 - 11 octombrie 2017)

În perioada 10 - 11 octombrie 2017, la Washington D.C., Statele Unite ale Americii, va avea loc workshop-ul parlamentar din marja reuniunii anuale a Grupului Băncii Mondiale și a Fondului Monetar Internațional. Camera Deputaților a Parlamentului României va fi reprezentată la această acțiune de doamna deputat **Rozália-Ibolya BIRÓ (UDMR)**, Președintele Comisiei pentru politică externă.

Pe ordinea de zi a reuniunii figurează o serie de prezentări și dezbateri pe teme precum: *perspectiva globală asupra pieței muncii și asupra creșterii economice; inegalitatea, globalizarea, schimbările tehnologice și comerțul; investiții în educație; reformele în domeniul energiei și dezvoltarea de instituții; schimbările climatice, migrația și adaptabilitatea în întâmpinarea dezastrelor; măsurarea fenomenului de fragilitate; modalități inovative de finanțare a dezvoltării; măsurile anti-corupție pentru transparența fiscală și prevenirea evaziunii fiscale de tip off-shore; protecția socială în cadrul acțiunilor WBG&IMF.*

În cadrul prezentărilor și dezbaterilor vor lua cuvântul oficiali ai Grupului Băncii Mondiale și ai Fondului Monetar Internațional, printre care îi amintim pe Președintele Rețelei Parlamentare a Grupului Băncii Mondiale și al Fondului Monetar Internațional Jeremy Lefroy, Directorul diviziei pentru Global Engagement a Băncii Mondiale, Jill Wilkins și doamna Sabina Bhatia, Director asistent pentru Comunicații în cadrul FMI.

Propunem:

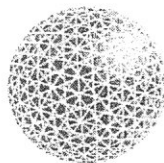

As a member of our delegation, we will also request your registration to attend the 2017 Annual Meetings - pending the approval of your country's IMF/World Bank Executive Director.

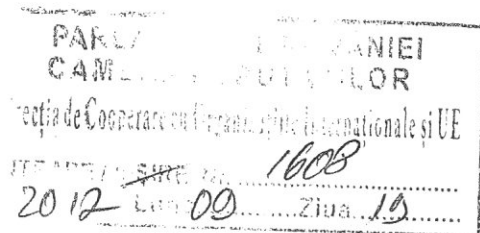

Inflation in advanced economies remains generally below targets and continues to decline in emerging economies, such as Brazil, India, and Russia. However, monetary policy normalization in the U.S. could trigger a faster-than-anticipated tightening in global financial conditions. Commodity exporters continue to face tight revenue flows, and financial stability risks persist in many emerging economies. Policy need to also watch for a</i>	Venue: TBC

10:45 am – Inequality, Globalization, Technological Change, and Trade 11:45 am	<i>Rising inequality has coincided with increasing global integration and significant technological advancements—while these have had many benefits for lower-income and emerging-market countries, some advanced economies have witnessed job losses and eroding market shares. Rising income inequality over recent decades has led to calls for governments to help people who are falling behind. 11:45 am – Investing in Education 12:45 pm	<i>Education is a key instrument for lifting populations out of poverty. It shifts outcomes for the individual and society at large. Education allows for healthier lives and more engaged citizens. It narrows gender and social gaps, and spurs productivity and economic growth. This provides a strong rationale for investing in education. As elected representatives, parliamentarians can have a strong influence on government decisions and actions in the field of education.
