**Tema:** Participarea la cea de-a 5-a Întâlnire parlamentară a Organizației pentru Cooperarea Economică și Dezvoltare (OCDE) (Paris, 8 – 10 februarie 2017)

În perioada 8 – 10 februarie 2017, domnul deputat **Corneliu – Mugurel Cozmanciuc (PNL)**, secretar al Biroului Permanent, va participa, la Paris, la cea de-a 5-a Întâlnire parlamentară a Organizației pentru Cooperarea Economică și Dezvoltare (OCDE), în calitate de membru al Subcomisiei Adunării Parlamentare a Consiliului Europei pentru relația cu OCDE și Banca Europeană pentru Reconstrucție și Dezvoltare.

Agenda propune dezbateri pe teme precum: Agenda 2030 și programele de finanțare pentru o dezvoltare durabilă, Acordul climatic de la Paris, rolul investițiilor, comerțului, educației, politicilor pentru sănătate în stimularea unei creșteri economice mai rapide, conexiunea dintre productivitate și incluziune socială, PISA 2015, rolul organizațiilor internaționale într-o mai bună reglementare a globalizării.

Reuniunea prevede și o sesiune de lucrări pe tema Instituțiilor fiscale independente, în cadrul căreia OCDE va prezenta reprezentanților legislativelor naționale studii de caz despre modul cum acestea pot consolida activitatea de control parlamentar și pot contribui la creșterea calității dezbaterilor publice pe tema politicilor fiscale.

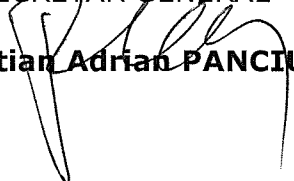
**Acțiunea are caracter parlamentar, conform Art. 3, alin. a) al HBP 1/2003, modificată și completată prin HBP 5/2007.**

**Propunem:**

- să se aprobe participarea domnului deputat **Corneliu – Mugurel Cozmanciuc (PNL)** la acțiunea menționată;
- deplasarea să se facă pe ruta București - Paris și retur, clasa Economic, cu plecare în ziua de 8 februarie 2017, ora 13.10 (RO 383) și întoarcere în ziua de 11 februarie 2017, ora 20.10 (RO 384) conform traseului anexat;
- să se acorde domnului deputat drepturi de diurnă categoria a II-a, 100%, pentru 3½ zile, majorată conform HBP 1/2003 cu modificările și completările ulterioare din HBP 5/2007, art. 27, alin. 2, litera a, cazare plafon B pentru 3 nopți, precum și un avans de 25% cu decontare ulterioară și, totodată, să se suporte din acesta eventuale alte taxe suplimentare cum ar fi taxele de oraș sau sejur percepute de hotel;
- să se suporte din bugetul Camerei Deputaților cheltuielile privind serviciile de asigurare contra accidentelor și asigurare de sănătate pentru perioada efectivă de deplasare;
- decontarea cheltuielilor să se facă la întoarcerea în țară, pe baza documentelor justificative.

**10.30 -11.30** **Exiting from the low growth trap: Investment**  
**Catherine Mann**, Chief Economist, G20 Finance Deputy and Special Counsellor to the Secretary-General, OECD

*The global economy remains in a low-growth trap with world GDP stuck in 2016 at around 3%, well-below the long-run average for the fifth consecutive year. Disappointing growth outcomes have led to weak consumption and investment, sustaining a vicious cycle of poor productivity improvements and further growth disappointments. Weak investment accounts for a large share of this poor productivity performance with capital spending in the OECD barely above the pre-crisis peak and well below the trajectory of past recoveries. Most strikingly, investment has not responded to the exceptionally low interest rates brought about by monetary policy.*

*Increases in investment are needed to push economies onto a higher growth path and this calls for decisive policy actions. During this presentation, OECD's Chief Economist will share insights into how fiscal initiatives and structural reforms can lead to higher growth without compromising debt sustainability.*

**11.30 - 12.20** **Exiting from the low growth trap: Trade**  
**Ken Ash**, Director, Trade and Agriculture, OECD

*Trade is facing strong headwinds today from a deeply sceptical public, with large parts of society feeling that globalisation is undermining, rather than underpinning, their livelihood. We need to recognise that trade can only work for everyone if governments apply the full panoply of national and international policies to ensure that more people benefit from the freer and fairer movement of information, ideas, technological innovations, as well as goods, services, capital and people, across borders. Trade and investment are important sources of productivity gains and essential ingredients in the global value chains that underpin our interconnected economies.*

*In this presentation, the OECD's Director for Trade and Agriculture will highlight how trade policy, as one element of a wider economic policy agenda, can help countries exit the low-growth trap.*

*Among the myriad challenges facing our economies, few pose greater obstacles to better economic performance than the productivity slowdown and the rise in inequalities. Are they influencing each other? OECD work on the productivity-inclusiveness nexus, presented at the 2016 OECD Ministerial Council Meeting, sets out what we know about the interactions between productivity and inclusiveness, identifies knowledge gaps, and charts win-win policies that boost productivity and tackle inequality.*

*Despite advances in business and technological transformations, we can no longer assume that they will automatically lead to better economic performance and stronger productivity growth. And there is no guarantee that the benefits of higher levels of growth, or higher levels of productivity in certain sectors, will be shared across the population as a whole. This session will explore how policy makers can adopt a broader, more inclusive approach to productivity growth – one that considers how to expand the productive assets of an economy by investing in individuals' skills and providing an environment where enterprises have a fair chance to succeed, including in lagging regions, generating strong and sustainable growth and opportunities for all.*

*Effective international rules and standards have proven to be beneficial for a sustainable world economy and shared well-being. International organisations play a key role in developing such rules and understanding how they operate and engage with stakeholders is important for ensuring their effectiveness.*

*To shed light on international standard setting, this presentation will illustrate recent OECD work collecting, comparing and assessing the practices of 50 international organisations on their governance arrangements, operational modalities, use of quality management disciplines and co-operation efforts. Looking at different types of organisations, our work identifies avenues for making their legal and policy instruments more effective, inclusive and relevant, in an effort to address the current discontent with globalisation arising from fragmented rules of the game.*

*Recognising the challenges of monitoring and evaluating the implementation and impact of international standards and guidelines, transparency, flexibility, focus and co-operation are vital to ensuring complementarity.*
