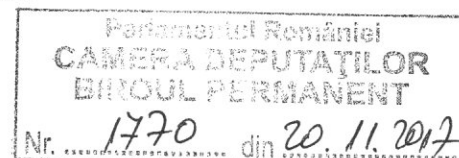

(Milano, Italia, 27 – 28 noiembrie 2017)

În perioada 27 – 28 noiembrie 2017, la Milano, Italia, se va desfășura cel de-al 39-lea Forum anual al rețelei Parlamentarii pentru Acțiune Globală (PGA).

Forumul - care este organizat de PGA, cu sprijinul Parlamentului italian și al Parlamentului European - va avea în dezbatere ca temă principală „Prevenirea extremismului violent și a atrocităților în masă: rolul parlamentarilor”.

Doamna deputat **Ana Birchall (PSD)**, Președintele Comisiei speciale comune a Camerei Deputaților și Senatului pentru coordonarea activităților parlamentare necesare pregătirii Președinției Consiliului UE din primul semestru al anului 2019, Președintele Delegației Parlamentului României la Adunarea Parlamentară a OSCE (AP OSCE), este invitată să participe și să se adreseze participanților, în calitate de membru al Comisiei ad hoc a AP OSCE pentru combaterea terorismului, în cadrul secțiunii cu sub-tema „Garantarea faptului că politicile și reglementările privind combaterea terorismului respectă drepturile omului”.

Acțiunea are caracter parlamentar conform art. 3, lit. e) din HBPr nr. 1/2003 cu modificările și completările din HBPr nr. 5/2007.

Propunem:

- să se aprobe participarea la această acțiune a doamnei deputat Ana Birchall;
- deplasarea să se efectueze cu avionul, clasa economic, pe ruta București – Amsterdam – Milano și retur, cu plecare din București în 26 noiembrie 2017, ora 08:35 (zbor KL 2700), și întoarcere în 30 noiembrie 2017, ora 00:30 (zbor KL1379), conform traseului anexat și solicitării doamnei deputat;
- să se acorde drepturi de diurnă categoria a II-a, 100%, majorată, pentru 4 zile;
- să se acorde, drepturi de cazare plafon B, pentru 3 nopți, la hotelul recomandat de organizatori;
- să se suporte din bugetul Camerei Deputaților cheltuielile privind serviciile de asigurare contra accidentelor și asigurare de sănătate pentru perioada efectivă de deplasare;

- să se acorde un avans de 40 % cu decontare ulterioară și, totodată, să se suporte din acesta eventuale alte taxe suplimentare, precum taxele de oraș sau sejur percepute de hotel;
- decontarea cheltuielilor se va face la întoarcerea în țară, pe baza documentelor justificative.

Dear Hon. Birchall,

It is our distinct honour to invite you to address the 39th Annual Forum of Parliamentarians for Global Action (PGA), on the topic of *Preventing Violent Extremism and Mass Atrocities: The Role of Parliamentarians*, which will take place at Palazzo Isimbardi, Headquarters of the Metropolitan City of Milan, from 27-28 November 2017.

In light of your leadership in countering violent extremism through your current role as member of the OSCE Parliamentary Assembly Ad Hoc Committee on Countering Terrorism and your former role as former Minister Delegate for European Affairs of Romania, we would be honoured if you were to address the high-level representatives and experts invited in Panel 4, on “Ensuring that counter-terrorism policies and regulations respect human rights.” The panel will take place at 9:15 AM on the 28th of November. It will focus on delivering proportionate law enforcement and security response in full respect of human rights, under the rule of law, to address the acts by violent extremists to prevent further deepening of the victimhood’s complex that can be used as a part of propaganda to recruit new members. (see enclosed draft programme).

Recent attacks directed against the civilian population underline the extent to which violent extremism no longer represents a localized trend, but has manifested itself as a global and trans-national threat. We are confronted with dangerous extremist ideologies that are used to justify mass atrocity crimes against civilians. The threat needs to be addressed in a holistic, integrated and multidimensional way, in particular through the building of more resilient democratic governance in all regions of the world, from the Middle East and North Africa (MENA) to the Sahel and Eastern regions of Africa to Southeast Asia, to pave the way for sustainable peace and stability. Effective measures and standards are necessary to remedy the spread of violent extremism and the perpetration of mass atrocities. So far, violence by extremist groups such as ISIS, Al Shabab, Boko Haram, Al Qaeda and other similar networks has been primarily countered through security and military measures, but the time has come to mobilize influential leaders at the National level to tackle the root causes of the problem.

Parliamentarians have a key role to play in adopting effective policies to marginalize and defeat the ideology of violent extremists through strategies that can bring about their isolation while promoting human rights, inclusion, democracy, justice and the Rule of Law, gender equality and healthy civil societies.

The Milan Forum on “Preventing Violent Extremism and Mass Atrocities: The Role of Parliamentarians” is hosted by the Mayor of Milan. The Forum receives the institutional patronage of the Italian Parliament and the high patronage of the European Parliament, and is organized by Parliamentarians for Global Action (PGA), the largest parliamentary network with membership of 1,400 Lawmakers in 142 countries, in partnership with the Montreal Institute of Genocide and Human Rights Studies (MIGS) and the Stanley Foundation.

We would be honoured to benefit from your participation in this international parliamentary conference and would greatly appreciate your participation in Panel 4 on the morning of Tuesday 28 November 2017.

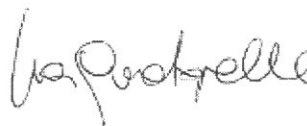

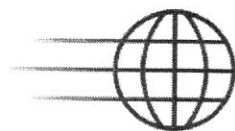

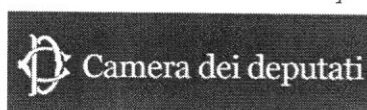

- *Acts of violent extremism and atrocities are committed by usage of a wide range of illegally obtained conventional arms and Weapons of Mass Destruction (WMDs): global priority to mitigate and eradicate this illicit trade*
